PURPOSE: The purpose of this legislation is to approve a supplemental appropriation for the Navajo Division of Public Safety.


This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committees. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each Council Delegate to review each proposed resolution in detail.

THOUSAND, SEVEN HUNDRED FORTY-SEVEN DOLLARS (\$2,416,747) TO THE
NAVAJO NATION DIVISION OF PUBLIC SAFETY

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION 1. AUTHORITY

A. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing of body of the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C.
§ 102(A).

B. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. §164 (A)(16) “[m]atters constituting an emergency shall be limited
to the cessation of law enforcement services, and disaster relief services, fire protection
services or other direct services required as an entitlement under Navajo Nation or
Federal law, or which directly threaten the sovereignty of the Navajo Nation. Such an
emergency matter must arise due to the pressing public need for such resolution(s) and
must be a matter requiring final action by the Council.”

1 C. This legislation is offered as an emergency due to the need to provide continuing law
2 enforcement services during the COVID-19 pandemic relief efforts.

3 D. The Navajo Nation Council has the authority to approve supplemental appropriations. 12
4 N.N.C. § 820(L). Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820 (L), “[t]he Navajo Nation Council may
5 adopt and approve supplemental appropriations to the Annual Comprehensive Budget
6 during the fiscal year. Supplemental appropriations of General Funds within the current
7 fiscal year are permitted, if and when additional sources of revenues above and beyond
8 the initial or current revenue projections are projected and which are also in excess of the
9 reserve amount set forth at § 820(J).”

10 E. The Title 12 Finance Act Supplemental Appropriation requirements include:

- 11 1. All requests for annual operating funds and supplemental funds shall be submitted
12 to the Office of Management and Budget for budget impact analysis. 12 N.N.C.
13 § 820(M).
- 14 2. When the Controller identifies additional sources of revenues above and beyond
15 the initial or current revenue projections, supplemental appropriations may be
16 approved by the Navajo Nation Council. 12 N.N.C. § 820(L).
- 17 3. Supplemental Appropriations made from non-recurring revenues shall only be
18 made for non-recurring operations or purposes, as set forth at § 820(F). The
19 Controller of the Navajo Nation shall be responsible for designation recurring and
20 non-recurring revenues. 12 N.N.C. § 820(L).
- 21 4. The Nation shall budget all recurring operating expenses, including capital
22 maintenance, from recurring revenues. Long term debt shall not be used to finance
23 recurring operating expenses. 12 N.N.C. §820(E).
- 24 5. The Navajo Nation Code provides, “[t]he Nation shall restrict non-recurring
25 revenues to budget non-recurring expenditures. In addition, non-recurring revenues
26 will be budgeted only after an examination by the Controller to determine whether
27 or not the revenues are subsidizing an imbalance between recurring revenues and
28 expenditures, and expenditures may be authorized only if a long-term (three-five
29 year) forecast shows that the operating deficit will not continue. Otherwise, non-
30 recurring revenues will be added to the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund balance.

1 This provision may be amended or waived by a two-thirds vote of the full Navajo
2 Nation Council.” 12 N.N.C. § 820(F).

4 **SECTION 2. FINDINGS**

5 A. The novel coronavirus (“COVID-19”) has caused a global pandemic and has hit the
6 Navajo Nation especially hard. As of April 9th, the Navajo Nation reported 488 cases
7 of COVID-19 and 20 deaths from the virus.

8 B. In an effort to reduce the spread of COVID-19 the President of the Navajo Nation
9 extended the previously declared State of Emergency on the Navajo Nation and
10 required government offices remain closed through April 26, 2020 in Executive Order
11 002-20.

12 C. The Navajo Nation Department of Health has issued a Public Health Emergency Orders
13 requiring Navajo Nation residents stay at home to mitigate the risk of spreading
14 COVID-19 and to preserve the health and safety of all individuals residing on the
15 Navajo Nation. Public Health Emergency Order No. 2020-003.

16 D. The Navajo Nation Department of Health also issued a Public Health Emergency
17 Orders extending the Stay at Home Order and implementing a curfew from 8:00 p.m.
18 through 5:00 a.m. for Navajo Nation residents. Public Health Emergency Order No.
19 2020-004.

20 E. This supplemental appropriation is requested the amount Two Million, Four Hundred
21 Sixteen Thousand, Seven Hundred Forty-Seven Dollars (\$2,416,747). The budget
22 documents are attached as **Exhibit A**.

23 F. Due to the emergency nature of this funding request, the budget impact analysis
24 required by 12 N.N.C. 820(M) can be provided by the Office of Management and
25 Budget when this matter is heard by Council either in person or telephonically.

26 G. Due to the emergency nature of this funding request the Controller can satisfy the
27 requirements provided in 12 N.N.C. § 820(L) when this matter is heard by Council
28 either in person or telephonically.

30 **SECTION 3. APPROVING SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING FROM THE**

1 **UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCE IN THE AMOUNT OF**
2 **TWO MILLION, FOUR HUNDRED SIXTEEN THOUSAND, SEVEN HUNDRED**
3 **FORTY-SEVEN DOLLARS (\$2,416,747) TO THE NAVAJO NATION DIVISION**
4 **OF PUBLIC SAFETY, BUSINESS UNIT**

5 A. This supplemental appropriation of \$2,416,747 shall be from that amount of funds
6 that exceeds the minimum fund balance of the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund
7 Balance as determined by the Office of the Controller and as indicated the documents
8 in **Exhibit A**.

9 B. The Navajo Nation hereby approves supplemental funding from the Unreserved,
10 Undesignated Fund Balance in the amount of \$2,416,747 for emergency funds as
11 indicated in the documents in **Exhibit A**.
