AMBER ALERT/WIRELESS EMERGENCY ALERTS UPDATE

WHAT IS WIRELESS EMERGENCY ALERTS?

 WIRELESS EMERGENCY ALERTS (WEAS) ARE SHORT EMERGENCY MESSAGES FROM AUTHORIZED FEDERAL, STATE, LOCAL, TRIBAL AND TERRITORIAL PUBLIC ALERTING AUTHORITIES THAT CAN BE BROADCAST FROM CELL TOWERS TO ANY WEA-ENABLED MOBILE DEVICE IN A LOCALLY TARGETED AREA. WIRELESS PROVIDERS PRIMARILY USE CELL BROADCAST TECHNOLOGY FOR WEA MESSAGE DELIVERY. WEA IS A PARTNERSHIP AMONG FEMA, THE FEDERAL COMMUNICATIONS COMMISSION (FCC) AND WIRELESS PROVIDERS TO ENHANCE PUBLIC SAFETY.



NNTRC EFFORTS TO CLOSE THE GAP ON WEA

- SINCE 2019 WE HAVE LEARNED NOT ALL CELLPHONES WITHIN NAVAJO NATION WERE RECEIVING WEA. WE FIRST IDENTIFIED ANDROID USERS WITH ONE OF OUR REGIONAL CELL PROVIDERS WAS NOT GETTING SUCH ALERTS. WE INVESTIGATED AND FOUND AN ISSUE BETWEEN THE SERVICE PROVIDER'S EQUIPMENT NOT COMMUNICATING WITH FEMA IPAWS NETWORK. WE ENGAGED IN WITH THE FEDERAL COMMUNICATIONS COMMISSION AND FEDERAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY (FEMA) TO CORRECT THIS MATTER.
- Once corrected on 5/13/20, we waited for another WEA to be sent out and confirm it was fixed. Great news is it was fixed for android users however we had one more challenge ahead. IPhone users were still not receiving such alerts and we identified that this was with multiple regional carriers.

Navajo Nation Leads the Way

On Monday, March 23, 2020, the Navajo Nation was among the initial alerting authorities and the first from a tribal nation to issue a live wireless emergency alert as part of the coronavirus (COVID-19) public health emergency response when 49 initial cases of COVID-19 were confirmed on the western part of the reservation. IPAWS enables public safety officials to deliver a single alert simultaneously through multiple communication devices, reaching as many people as possible during a weather-related or other emergency to save lives and protect property.

The Navajo Nation is composed of 110 chapters (local jurisdictions) 11 counties, two satellite reservations and seven police districts covering 27,000 square miles. It extends into three FEMA Regions and states that include Region 6 (New Mexico), Region 8 (Utah) and Region 9 (Arizona).

Lavina Willie-Nez, Deputy Director of the Navajo Nation's Department of Emergency Management, "pushed the button" to send that initial alert. She and Navajo Nation Emergency Management Director Harland Cleveland will join the webinar to discuss their experience using IPAWS and to take questions. 

THIS WILL ENSURE THEY WILL BE ABLE TO RECEIVE WIRELESS EMERGENCY ALERTS. THE NNTRC COMMISSIONERS AND ATTORNEYS WORKED HARD TO CLOSE THIS GAP AND WE ARE HAPPY TO CELEBRATE THIS MOMENTOUS OCCASION. THIS CLOSES THE BIGGEST GAP FOR WIRELESS EMERGENCY ALERTS ON THE NAVAJO NATION.
