TITLE OF RESOLUTION: AN ACTION RELATING TO AN EMERGENCY AND THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; SELECTING A SPEAKER *PRO TEM* TO PERFORM LIMITED DUTIES FROM JANUARY 10 TO JANUARY 23, 2023 OR WHEN THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL CONFIRMS A SPEAKER FOR THE 25TH NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL

PURPOSE: The purpose of the resolution is to approve the Speaker *Pro Tem* for the 25th Navajo Nation Council for the period beginning January 10, 2023 and ending when the Navajo Nation Council confirms the Speaker to be selected on January 23, 2023. 2 N.N.C. §§ 281 (B) and 282 (C).

This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committees. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each Council Delegate to review each proposed resolution in detail.

RELATING TO AN EMERGENCY AND THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; SELECTING A SPEAKER *PRO TEM* TO PERFORM LIMITED DUTIES FROM JANUARY 10 TO JANUARY 23, 2023, OR WHEN THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL CONFIRMS A SPEAKER FOR THE 25TH NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL

SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

BE IT ENACTED:

- A. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing body of the Navajo Nation and shall consist of 24 delegates. 2 N.N.C. §102 (A).
- B. The Speaker of the Navajo Nation is selected by and serves at the pleasure of the Navajo Nation Council. See 2 N.N.C. §§ 282 (A) and (C).
- C. The Navajo Nation Council has the authority to promulgate rules, regulations and procedures for the conduct of its meetings and that of its committees. 2 N.N.C. § 102 (E).
- D. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164 (A)(16) "Matters constituting an emergency shall be limited to the cessation of law enforcement services, and disaster relief services, fire protection services or other direct services required as an entitlement under the Navajo Nation or Federal law, or which directly threaten the sovereignty of the

Navajo Nation. Such an emergency matter must arise due to the pressing public need for such resolution(s) and must be a matter requiring final action by the Council."

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

§ 281 (A).

B. The Speaker of the Navajo Nation Council shall be a member of the Navajo Nation Council in good standing. 2 N.N.C. § 281 (B).

A. There is established the Office of the Speaker of the Navajo Nation Council. 2 N.N.C.

C. The 25th Navajo Nation Council delegates are scheduled to be sworn into office at noon on January 10, 2023.

D. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 282 (C), the Speaker of the Navajo Nation Council is selected and confirmed by the Navajo Nation Council as the first order of business at the Council session scheduled for the fourth Monday in January of any odd numbered year.

E. In order that the selection of a Speaker for the 25th Navajo Nation Council be chosen in an orderly and efficient manner and that the necessary administrative and ministerial duties of the Legislative Branch be fulfilled in the interim, a Speaker Pro Tem shall be selected by the delegates of the 25th Navajo Nation Council once they have been sworn into office.

F. Pursuant to Navajo Nation Council Resolution CJA-03-11 attached herein as Exhibit A, each Council shall be authorized to select a Speaker pursuant to its own process and procedures or to utilize the process and procedures set forth in Section 3 of CJA-03-11.

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G. This matters meets the emergency legislation criteria of 2 N.N.C. § 164 (A)(16) as the 25th Navajo Nation Council cannot operate to protect direct services to the Navajo people or protect the Navajo's sovereignty without an official head of the Legislative Branch to execute administrative and ministerial duties.

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SECTION THREE. ADOPTION OF RULES FOR SELECTION OF SPEAKER PRO **TEM**

For the purposes of selecting its Speaker *Pro Tem*, the 25th Navajo Nation Council hereby adopts the Rules in the Selection of the Speaker set forth in Section 3 of CJA-03-11, attached as **Exhibit A**.

SECTION FOUR. SELECTION OF SPEAKER PRO TEM

- A. The Navajo Nation Council hereby selects the Honorable

 as Speaker *Pro Tem* for the 25th Navajo Nation

 Council for the period beginning January 10, 2023 and ending when the Navajo

 Nation Council confirms the Speaker to be selected on January 23, 2023. 2 N.N.C.

 §§ 281 (B) and 282 (C).
- B. The Navajo Nation Council hereby authorizes the Speaker *Pro Tem* to perform the following limited duties from January 10, 2023 thorough January 23, 2023 or when the Navajo Nation Council confirms a Speaker for the 25th Navajo Nation Council.
 - Preside over the January 10, 2023 Special Session of the Navajo Nation Council and the Winter Session on January 23, 2023 until the Navajo Nation Council confirms the newly selected Speaker.
 - 2. Approve travel requests for Navajo Nation Council delegates.
 - 3. Supervise all Program Directors in the Legislative Branch by approval of leave, travel and payment requests. Any perceived reason for disciplinary action shall be documented and reported in writing to the newly confirmed Speaker.
 - 4. When necessary, travel to represent the Navajo Nation upon written request by the Navajo Nation general public, President, or Vice-President of the Navajo Nation, or other sovereign entities such as the federal government, the states of Arizona, New Mexico, Utah or subdivisions thereof.
 - 5. Call a work session(s) as needed.
- C. The Navajo Nation Council hereby authorizes the Speaker *Pro Tem* to receive, in addition to his or her salary as a delegate pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 106 (A), the salary enhancement authorized for the Speaker in an amount equivalent to the daily rate of

the salary established at 2 N.N.C. § 284 for the period of the Speaker *Pro Tem* appointment. In addition, for the period of his or her *Pro Tem* appointment, the Speaker *Pro Tem* shall be provided either housing in Window Rock at the Navajo Nation's expense or an official vehicle with which to commute daily from his or her resident to Window Rock.

SECTION FIVE. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This Action and the selection of the Speaker *Pro Tem* shall be effective pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 221 (C).

RESOLUTION OF THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL

22nd NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL - First Year 2011

AN ACTION

RELATING TO THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; RESCINDING CJA-1-93 AND CJA-02-99, RESOLUTIONS ADDRESSING THE PROCESS AND PROCEDURE FOR THE SELECTION AND CONFIRMATION OF THE SPEAKER OF THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL TO SELECT ITS SPEAKER AND ADOPT A PROCESS AND PROCEDURE ACCORDINGLY

BE IT ENACTED:

Section 1. Findings and Purpose

- 1. The number of delegates to the Navajo Nation Council was reduced from 88 to 24 members by vote of Diné voters.
- 2. Pursuant to Navajo Nation law, the Navajo Nation Council is authorized to select a speaker from among its membership. The selection of the speaker is an internal process of the Navajo Nation Council.
- 3. In January 1993, the Navajo Nation Council adopted rules in the selection of Speaker of the Navajo Nation Council. CJA-01-93. These rules were amended in special Session of the Navajo Nation Council in 1999. CJA-02-99 (Document No. 2026).
- 4. In accordance with Diné tradition, the rules in the selection of the Speaker must be inclusive and allow broader participation by all delegates to the Navajo Nation Council. The process involved in the selection of a Diné leader is done in a democratic manner, with utmost participation by every delegate of the Navajo Nation Council.
 - 5. In order that the requirements of 2 N.N.C. § 282 (C) be met and that the selection and confirmation of the speaker of the Navajo Nation Council be the first order of business at the council session scheduled for the fourth Monday in January of 2011 and this selection be done in a manner consistent with Navajo tradition and the intent of the $22^{\rm nd}$ Navajo Nation Council.

Section 2. Rescinding CJA-1-93 and CJA-02-99

The Navajo Nation Council rescinds CJA-1-93 and CJA-02-99.

Section 3. Rules in the Selection of the Speaker

For the 22nd Navajo Nation Council, the Navajo Nation Council hereby adopts the following rules:

- Each Council of the Navajo Nation shall be authorized to select a Speaker pursuant to its own process.
- The Speaker shall be selected as the first order of business at the Winter Session of the Navajo Nation Council, January 2011. The Speaker shall be selected and confirmed by the Navajo Nation Council as the first item of business at the council session scheduled for the fourth Monday in January of any odd numbers year, 2 N.N.C. § 282 (C).
- Read the powers and duties of the speaker, as written in 2 N.N.C. Section 285 into the record.
- 4. Any delegate may nominate another delegate to serve as Speaker with no second required. If the current Speaker is nominated and accepts the nomination, he/she shall point a Speaker pro tem pursuant to 2 N N.C. 285(b)(3).
- The number of nominations shall be unlimited, except upon motion, second and majority vote on closing the nomination process.
- Each nominee shall accept or reject a nomination upon being nominated.
- 7. Each nomines, in order of his or her draw, shall be allowed to make a 15-minuite statement on his or her platform for Speaker.
- Each nominee, in the order of his or her draw, shall be allowed to make a 15-minute statement on his or her platform for Speaker.
- 9. Questions shall not be allowed.

- 10. Upon presentations by nominees, each member of the Navajo Nation Council present shall cast one vote for a candidate by secret ballot. The Navajo Nation Election Administration shall assist in the balloting.
- 11. In the event there are more than two nominees, there shall be a run-off election between the two candidates receiving the most votes. At which time, the final two candidates will be allowed 5 minute statement before final vote, with no questions or comments. This run-off election procedure shall not apply in the event candidates and is hereby declared the winner.
- 12. In the event of a tie vote, selection shall be by random lot.
- 13. The Council shall by resolution confirm its new Speaker
