TITLE OF RESOLUTION: AN ACTION RELATING TO AN EMERGENCY AND THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; SELECTING AND CONFIRMING THE SPEAKER OF THE 25<sup>TH</sup> NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL

**PURPOSE:** This resolution, if approved, will select and confirm the Speaker of the 25<sup>th</sup> Navajo Nation Council.

This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committee. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each committee member to review the proposed resolution in detail.

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15	BE IT ENACTED:
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17	SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY
18	A. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing body of the Navajo Nation and shall
19	consist of 24 delegates. 2 N.N.C. §102 (A).
20	B. The Navajo Nation Council shall select and confirm a Speaker of the Navajo Nation
21	Council as the first order of business at the Council session scheduled for the fourth
22	Monday in January of any odd numbered year. 2 N.N.C. § 282 (C).
23	C. The Navajo Nation Council has the authority to promulgate rules, regulations and
24	procedures for the conduct of its meetings and that of its committees. 2 N.N.C. § 102
25	(E).
26	D. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164 (A)(16) "Matters constituting an emergency shall be
27	limited to the cessation of law enforcement services, and disaster relief services, fire
28	protection services or other direct services required as an entitlement under the
29	Navajo Nation or Federal law, or which directly threaten the sovereignty of the

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Navajo Nation. Such an emergency matter must arise due to the pressing public need for such resolution(s) and must be a matter requiring final action by the Council."

# SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- A. There is established the Office of the Speaker of the Navajo Nation Council. 2 N.N.C. § 281 (A).
- B. The Speaker of the Navajo Nation Council shall be a member of the Navajo Nation Council in good standing. 2 N.N.C. § 281 (B).
- C. The Speaker of the Navajo Nation Council shall serve at the pleasure of the Navajo Nation Council and shall serve for a term of two (2) years. 2 N.N.C. § 282 (A) (B).
- D. This legislation is put forth as an emergency legislation pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164 (A)(16) as the 25th Navajo Nation Council has a statutory mandate to select and confirm its Speaker as the first order of business at the 25th Navajo Nation Council's Winter Session statutorily scheduled to start on January 23, 2023.
- E. Dangerous and potentially life-threatening winter travel conditions, unreliable internet access, and staff illnesses interfered with the ability to satisfy the five-day posting requirement of 2 N.N.C. § 164 (A)(7), prior to the start of the Council's Winter Session.
- F. If the 25th Navajo Nation Council does not select and confirm their Speaker on the fourth Monday in January (January 23, 2023), the Council will not be able to take any action to ensure that adequate funding and emergency services are available to support Navajo communities through the projected upcoming winter storms and dangerous conditions.
- G. In light of the above, there is indeed a "pressing public need" for this emergency legislation.

# SECTION THREE. ADOPTION OF RULES FOR SELECTION OF SPEAKER

A. Pursuant to Navajo Nation Council Resolution CJA-03-11 attached herein as Exhibit A, each Council shall be authorized to select a Speaker pursuant to its own process

1	and procedures or to utilize the process and procedures set forth in Section 3 of CJA-
2	03-11.
3	B. For the purposes of selecting its Speaker, the 25 <sup>th</sup> Navajo Nation Council hereby
4	adopts the Rules in the Selection of the Speaker set forth in Section 3 of CJA-03-11,
5	attached as Exhibit A.
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7	SECTION FOUR. SELECTION AND CONFIRMATION
8	A. The Navajo Nation Council hereby selects the Honorable
9	as Speaker of the 25 <sup>th</sup> Navajo Nation Council.
10	B. The Navajo Nation Council, pursuant to its authority under Navajo Nation law,
11	hereby confirms the Honorable to serve as Speaker
12	of the 25th Navajo Nation Council for a two year term with all powers and duties
13	delegated by Navajo Nation law.
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15	SECTION FIVE. EFFECTIVE DATE.
16	This Action and the selection of the Speaker of the 25 <sup>th</sup> Navajo Nation Council shall be
17	effective pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 221 (C).

# RESOLUTION OF THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL

# 22nd NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL - First Year 2011 .

## AN ACTION

RELATING TO THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; RESCINDING CJA-1-93 AND CJA-02-99, RESOLUTIONS ADDRESSING THE PROCESS AND PROCEDURE FORTHE SELECTION AND CONFIRMATION OF THE SPEAKER OF THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL TO SELECT ITS SPEAKER AND ADOPT A PROCESS AND PROCEDURE ACCORDINGLY

#### BE IT ENACTED:

#### Saction 1. Findings and Purpose

- 1. The number of delegates to the Novajo Nation Council was reduced from 88 to 24 members by vote of Diné voters.
- 2. Pursuant to Navajo Nation law, the Navajo Nation Council is authorized to select a speaker from among its membership. The selection of the speaker is an internal process of the Navajo Nation Council.
- 3. In January 1993, the Navajo Nation Council adopted rules in the selection of Speaker of the Navajo Nation Council. CJA-01-93. These rules were amended in special Session of the Navajo Nation Council in 1999. CJA-02-99 (Document No. 2026).
- 4. In accordance with Diné tradition, the rules in the selection of the Speaker must be inclusive and allow broader participation by all delegates to the Navajo Nation Council. The process involved in the selection of a Diné leader is done in a democratic manner, with utmost participation by every delegate of the Navajo Nation Council.
- 5. In order that the requirements of 2 N.N.C. § 282 (C) be met and that the selection and confirmation of the speaker of the Navajo Nation Council be the first order of business at the council session scheduled for the fourth Monday in January of 2011 and this selection be done in a manner consistent with Navajo tradition and the intent of the 22<sup>nd</sup> Navajo Nation Council.

Section 2. Rescinding COA-1-93 and COA-02-99

The Navajo Nation Council rescinds CJA-1-93 and CJA-02-99.

Section 3. Rules in the Selection of the Speaker

For the 22<sup>nd</sup> Navajo Nation Council, the Navajo Nation Council hereby adopts the following rules:

- Each Council of the Navajo Nation shall be authorized to select a Speaker pursuant to its own process.
- 2. The Speaker shall be selected as the first order of business at the Winter Session of the Navajo Nation Council, January 2011. The Speaker shall be selected and confirmed by the Navajo Nation Council as the first item of business at the council session scheduled for the fourth Monday in January of any odd numbers year, 2 N.N.C. S 282 (C).
- Read the powers and duties of the speaker, as written in 2 N.N.C. Section 285 into the record.
- 4. Any delegate may nominate another delegate to serve as Speaker with no second required. If the current Speaker is nominated and accepts the nomination, he/she shall point a Speaker pro tem pursuant to 2 N N.C. 285(b)(3).
- The number of nominations shall be unlimited, except upon motion, second and majority vote on closing the nomination process.
- 6. Each nominee shall accept or reject a nomination upon being nominated.
- Each nominee, in order of his or her draw, shall be allowed to make a 15-minuite statement on his or her platform for Speaker.
- Each nominee, in the order of his or her draw, shall be allowed to make a 15-minute statement on his or her platform for Speaker.
- 9. Questions shall not be allowed.

- 10. Upon presentations by nominees, each member of the Navajo Nation Council present shall cast one vote for a candidate by secret ballot. The Navajo Nation Election Administration shall assist in the balloting.
- 11. In the event there are more than two nominees, there shall be a run-off election between the two candidates receiving the most votes. At which time, the final two candidates will be allowed 5 minute statement before final vote, with no questions or comments. This run-off election procedure shall not apply in the event candidates and is hereby declared the winner.
- 12. In the event of a tie vote, selection shall be by random lot.
- 13. The Council shall by resolution confirm its new Speaker
