Purpose of this Legislation:

to approve \$2,644,380 from the Sihasin Fund for DCD to purchase emergency vehicles and equipment for the Ganado Fire District (redo of CO-53-21 that was approved and signed into law on November 2, 2021 that originally approved this money; new legislation is needed because funds reverted)

AUTHORITY 19 A. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing body of the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. §102(A). 20 As such, the Council may approve appropriations from the Navajo Nation's Síhasin Fund. 21 B. 12 N.N.C. §2502, as amended by CJA-03-18, states the purpose of the Navajo Nation Síhasin 22 Fund ("Síhasin Fund") as follows: 23 24 §2502 Purpose A. The purposes of this Fund are to provide financial support and/or financing for: 25 1. The planning and development of economic development and regional infrastructure 26 supporting economic development and community development, including such 27 infrastructure as, but not limited to, housing, commercial and government buildings, 28 waterline, solid waste management development, powerline Projects, and 29 transportation and communication systems, within the Navajo Nation; . . . 30

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- B. For the Purpose in §2502(A)(1), Fund expenditures for infrastructure shall not be limited by 12 N.N.C. §1310(F) or TCDCJY-77-99.
- C. Leveraging the Fund by way of guaranteeing loans, match funding, direct funding in part, and other weighted uses of the Fund, including loan financing from the Fund, for the purposes in §2502(A)(1), shall be favored over direct funding in whole.
- C. The Síhasin Fund provides that "Fund Principal" shall consist of all deposits made to the Síhasin Fund and that "Fund Income" shall consist of all earnings (interest, dividends, etc.) generated and realized by the Fund Principal, and that Síhasin Fund Income shall be deposited in, and added to, the Fund Principal until such time as a Fund Expenditure Plan is duly approved. 12 N.N.C. §2504 and §2505(C).
- D. The Síhasin Fund also provides that "Fund Principal and Income shall not be expended except pursuant to a Fund Expenditure Plan consistent with the purposes set forth in §2502 of this Chapter and adopted by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of all members of the Navajo Nation Council." 12 N.N.C. §2505(A).
- E. As the governing body of the Navajo Nation, the Navajo Nation Council may consider and approve emergency legislation. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. §164(A)(16), "[m]atters constituting an emergency . . . [include] fire protection services or other direct services required as an entitlement under Navajo Nation or Federal law, or which directly threaten the sovereignty of the Navajo Nation. Such an emergency matter must arise due to the pressing public need for such resolution(s) and must be a matter requiring final action by the Council." 2 N.N.C. §164(A)(16).
- F. This Action is offered as emergency legislation because it satisfies the "fire protection services" purpose in 2 N.N.C. §164(A)(16). There is also a "pressing public need" for this resolution because the Division of Community Development is unable to purchase the emergency equipment and vehicles for the Ganado Fire District without the requested funds.

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

A. Ganado Fire District is a political subdivision of the State of Arizona that provides critical emergency services to Ganado, Steamboat, Kindahlichii, Klagetoh, Cornfields, Woodsprings, Cross Canyon, Bashbito, Toyei, and other Navajo Nation communities.

- C. Ganado Fire District has provided a listing of its monthly activity statistics, as compared to those of the Navajo Police Department, for the first seven months of 2020 and all of 2019. **EXHIBIT B**. These statistics show a dire need for the requested emergency vehicles and equipment. Notably, the District's fire/rescue/emergency activities are expected to increase with the end of COVID-19-related closures and stay-at-home orders on the Navajo Nation.
- D. Ganado Fire District has provided its 2019-2020 and its 2020-2021 budgets. **EXHIBIT C**. These budgets show a significant shortfall, such that \$2,644,380 is requested to purchase the needed emergency vehicles and equipment to serve the described Navajo communities.
- E. Ganado Fire District has provided detailed descriptions of the fire apparatus/equipment and rescue/medical transport units for which it is requesting funds. **EXHIBIT D.**
- F. The Navajo Nation Chapters of Ganado, Kindahlichii, Klagetoh, Cornfields, Jeddito, Nazlini, and Greasewood Springs, have all adopted resolutions supporting the request for funding for the purchase of the fire apparatus/equipment and rescue/medical transport units for the Ganado Fire District. **EXHIBIT E**.
- G. In October of 2021 the Navajo Nation Council approved Resolution No. CO-53-21, which was signed into law on November 2, 2021. Resolution No. CO-53-21 approved \$2,644,380 from the Síhasin Fund for the Division of Community Development to purchase the needed emergency equipment and vehicles for the Ganado Fire District, and approved the related Expenditure Plan for these funds pursuant to 12 N.N.C. §2501-§2508. See **EXHIBIT F** (Exhibits under CO-53-21 are omitted).
- H. The equipment and vehicles listed in **EXHIBIT D** are necessary for the Ganado Fire District to meet the fire response and other emergency needs of the Ganado Chapter and several surrounding Navajo Nation communities.
- I. Due to supply chain issues and other extreme delays resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic, DCD has been unable to complete the purchase of the emergency equipment and vehicles for the Ganado Fire District, as approved in CO-53-21, and the approved funds have reverted.
- J. DCD has therefore requested new legislation for the same \$2,644,380 in Sihasin funds

originally approved in CO-53-21, and that a new funds reversion deadline be set for March 31, 2024. This new deadline will allow DCD enough time to complete the purchase of the emergency equipment and vehicles, and will give the seller sufficient time to properly tailor the equipment and vehicles to meet the Ganado Fire District's particular needs and specifications. **EXHIBIT G**.

K. Given the recurring droughts each summer on the Navajo Nation, the danger of wildfires is extremely high every year, hampering economic development and new infrastructure. The Navajo Nation therefore finds that using the Síhasin Fund for the purchase of emergency vehicles and equipment for the Ganado Fire District, is within the purposes of 12 N.N.C. §2502(A)(1) and 2 N.N.C. §164(A)(16), and is in the best interests of Navajo communities and the Navajo People.

SECTION THREE. APPROVING \$2,644,380 FROM THE SÍHASIN FUND FOR THE DIVISION OF COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT TO PURCHASE EMERGENCY VEHICLES AND EQUIPMENT FOR THE GANADO FIRE DISTRICT; APPROVING THE RELATED EXPENDITURE PLAN

- A. The Navajo Nation hereby approves \$2,644,380 from the Sihasin Fund to the Division of Community Development for DCD's purchase of the fire apparatus/equipment and rescue/medical transport units for the Ganado Fire District, as described herein.
- B. The Navajo Nation hereby approves the Ganado Fire District Sihasin Expenditure Plan as set forth in the attached **EXHIBIT A**, **EXHIBIT D**, and **EXHIBIT G**.
- C. The Síhasin funds allocated for the Expenditure Plan approved herein may be further leveraged by bond or loan financing pursuant to the Navajo Nation Bond Financing Act, at 12 N.N.C. §1300 et seq., as amended, using Síhasin Fund earnings for repayment and financing costs upon the recommendation of the Budget and Finance Committee and approval by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of all members of the Navajo Nation Council.
- D. The Navajo Nation Controller shall determine whether the source of the \$2,644,380 allocation from the Síhasin Fund will be from Fund Principal or Fund Income or a combination of both.

- E. The Sihasin funds approved herein shall be disbursed to the DCD within twenty (20) business days following the effective date of this Action.
- F. Upon receipt of the approved funds, DCD shall promptly purchase the emergency vehicles and equipment listed in **EXHIBIT A**, **EXHIBIT D**, and **EXHIBIT G**, and shall arrange for delivery of the items and transfer of titles to the Ganado Fire District.
- G. Ganado Fire District ("GFD") shall be solely responsible for the operation, maintenance, and repairs of the emergency vehicles and equipment purchased for the District by DCD; and, as a condition of receiving title to the vehicles and equipment, GFD shall obtain appropriate liability and other appropriate insurance for all items received. Upon delivery and transfer of title to GFD, the Navajo Nation shall not be liable for any condition or event pertaining to any of the emergency vehicles and equipment provided to GFD.
- H. Any and all cost-savings shall be returned to the Síhasin Fund once all items are purchased by DCD, and the funds approved herein shall revert to the Síhasin Fund principal if not spent or encumbered by March 31, 2024.

SECTION FOUR. DIRECTIVE

The Division of Community Development shall provide regular written reports on the status of its expenditures of the Síhasin funds approved herein. These reports shall be submitted to the Naabik'iyati' Committee and to the Office of the President and Vice-President by the fifth day of each month following the effective date of this Action.

SECTION FIVE. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Action and the related Expenditure Plan shall become effective pursuant to 12 N.N.C. §2505(A) and 2 N.N.C. §221(B).

SECTION SIX. SAVING CLAUSE

If any part of this Action is invalidated by the Supreme Court of the Navajo Nation, or by any Navajo Nation District Court without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, the remainder of this Action shall be the law of the Navajo Nation.

Ganado Fire District Requesting Appropriation of \$2,644,380.00 from the Navajo Nation Shihasin Funds from the 24th Navajo Nation Council, the Navajo Nation Office of the Speaker and the Navajo Nation Office of the President and Vice President for the purpose of combating the Pandemic COVID-19 Coronavirus.

WHEREAS,

- GANADO FIRE DISTRICT is seeking \$2,644,380.00 from the Shihasin Funds to assistance Navajo Nation combat COVID-19 Coronavirus;
- GANADO FIRE DISTRICT provided fire, rescue, medical, and emergency dispatching services to five chapters, which include Ganado, Steamboat, Klagetoh, Kinlichee, Cornfields and the communities of Woodsprings, Cross Canyon, Bashbito, and Toyei; but not limited to the 1,000 square miles covered through Mutual Aid agreements and our firm mission to achieve life safety for all residence.
- GANADO FIRE DISTRICT provided emergency and essential response to the Navajo people, our customers and visiting guest since 1982.
- GANADO FIRE DISTRICT is seeking assistance to purchase six fire apparatus and four rescue/medical transport units (a.k.a. ambulance) to combat the Pandemic COVID-19 Coronavirus.
- GANADO FIRE DISTRICT is seeking the support from Navajo Nation for the purpose of obtaining adequate and reliable apparatus, supporting Ganado Fire District essential emergency staff to provide emergency services to the Navajo Nation citizens.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESLOVED THAT,

- The Ganado Fire District Governing Board is seeking approval of \$2,644,380.00 from the Navajo Nation Shihasin funds from the 24th Navajo Nation Council, the Navajo Nation Office of the Speaker and Navajo Nation President and Vice President Office from to combat the Pandemic COVID-19 Coronavirus.
- 2. Ganado Fire District Governing Board further request that the 24th Navajo Nation Council, the Navajo Nation Office of the Speaker and the Navajo Nation President and Vice President Office for the purpose of obtaining adequate and reliable apparatus for the next twenty years, to continuing to provide adequate fire, rescue, medical, and emergency dispatching services to five chapters, which include Ganado, Steamboat, Klagetoh, Kinlichee, Cornfields and the communities of Woodsprings, Cross Canyon, Beshbatoh, and Toyei; but not limited to the 1,000 square miles covered through Mutual Aid agreements for Navajo Nation citizens.

RESOLUTION OF THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL 24th NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL - THIRD YEAR, 2021

AN ACTION

RELATING TO AN EMERGENCY AND THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; ALLOCATING \$2,644,380.00 FROM THE SÍHASIN FUND TO THE DIVISION OF COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT FOR THE PURCHASE OF FIRE TRUCKS AND AMBULANCES FOR THE GANADO FIRE DISTRICT; ADOPTING THE SÍHASIN GANADO FIRE DISTRICT EMERGENCY VEHICLE EXPENDITURE PLAN PURSUANT TO 12 N.N.C §§ 2501 - 2508

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

- A. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing body of the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. § 102(A).
- B. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(16), "[m] atters constituting an emergency shall be limited to the cessation of law enforcement services, and disaster relief services, fire protection services or other direct services required as an entitlement under Navajo Nation or Federal law, or which directly threaten the sovereignty of the Navajo Nation. Such an emergency matter must arise due to the pressing public need for such resolution(s) and must be a matter requiring final action by the Council." 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(16).
- C. The Navajo Nation Code provides that the purpose of the Navajo Nation Sihasin Fund ("Sihasin Fund") is as follows:

§ 2502 Purpose

- A. The purposes of this Fund are to provide financial support and/or financing for:
 - 1. The planning and development of economic development and regional infrastructure supporting economic development, and community development, including such infrastructure as, but not limited to, housing, commercial and government buildings, waterline, solid waste management development, powerline projects, and transportation and communication systems, within the Navajo Nation; and . . .
- B. For the Purpose in § 2502(A)(1), Fund expenditures for infrastructure shall not be limited by 12 N.N.C. § 1310(F) or TCDCJY-77-99.

C. Leveraging the Fund by way of guaranteeing loans, match funding, direct funding in part, and other weighted uses of the Fund, including loan financing from the Fund, for the purposes in § 2502(A)(I), shall be favored over direct funding in whole.

12 N.N.C. § 2502, as amended by CJA-03-18.

D. The Sihasin Fund provides that "Fund Principal" shall consist of all deposits made to the Sihasin Fund and that "Fund Income" shall consist of all earnings (interest, dividends, etc.) generated and realized by the Fund Principal, and that Fund Income shall be deposited in and added to Fund Principal until such time as a Fund Expenditure Plan is duly adopted. 12 N.N.C. §§ 2504 and 2505(C).

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- A. Ganado Fire District is a political subdivision of the State of Arizona that provides emergency services to the Navajo Nation communities of Ganado, Steamboat, Kin Dah Łichíi', Klagetoh, Cornfields, Woodsprings, Cross Canyon, Beshbito, Toyei, and others.
- B. The Ganado Fire District has need for \$2,644,380.00 worth of fire apparatus and rescue/medical transport units, to meet the fire and other emergency needs of the Ganado Chapter and surrounding Navajo Nation communities. Exhibit A.
- C. Ganado Fire District has provided a listing of its monthly activity statistics, as compared to those of the Navajo Nation Police Department, for the first seven months of 2020 and all of 2019. Exhibit B. These statistics show an urgent need for the requested emergency vehicles.
- D. Ganado Fire District has provided its 2019-2020 and its 2020-2021 budgets. Exhibit C. These budgets show a shortfall, such that the \$2,644,380.00 in funding is needed to purchase the requested emergency vehicles.
- E. Ganado Fire District has provided detailed descriptions of the fire apparatus and rescue/medical transport units that it is requesting. Exhibit D.
- F. The Navajo Nation Chapters of Ganado, Steamboat, Kin Dah Lichii', Klagetoh, Cornfields, Jeddito, Nazlini, Greasewood Springs, and the District 17 Council, have all adopted resolutions supporting the request for funding for the purchase

- of the fire apparatus and rescue/medical transport units for Ganado Fire District. Exhibit E.
- G. Given the current drought situation on the Navajo Nation, the danger of wildfires is extremely high. This legislation is offered as an emergency action, because it meets the "fire protection services" purpose in 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(16), and it also addresses a "pressing public need" as listed in 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(16).
- H. The Navajo Nation Council finds that using the Sihasin Fund for the purchase of emergency vehicles, as set forth on Page 3 of Exhibit A, is within the purposes of 12 N.N.C. § 2502(A)(1) and 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(16), and is in the best interests of Navajo communities and the Navajo People.

SECTION THREE. ALLOCATION OF \$2,644,380.00 TO THE DIVISION OF COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AND APPROVAL AND ADOPTION OF THE SÍHASIN GANADO FIRE DISTRICT EMERGENCY VEHICLE EXPENDITURE PLAN

- A. The Navajo Nation Council hereby allocates \$2,644,380.00 from the Sihasin Fund to the Division of Community Development to implement the Sihasin Ganado Fire District Emergency Vehicle Expenditure Plan as detailed in Exhibit A.
- B. The Navajo Nation Council hereby approves and adopts the Sihasin Ganado Fire District Emergency Vehicle Expenditure Plan as set forth in Exhibit A.
- C. The Sihasin Funds allocated for the Sihasin Ganado Fire District Emergency Vehicle Expenditure Plan may be further leveraged by bond or loan financing pursuant to the Navajo Nation Bond Financing Act, 12 N.N.C. § 1300 et seq., as amended, using Sihasin Fund earnings for repayment and financing costs, upon the recommendation of the Budget and Finance Committee and approval by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of all members of the Navajo Nation Council.

SECTION FOUR. APPROVAL OF SÍHASIN GANADO FIRE DISTRICT EMERGENCY VEHICLE EXPENDITURE PLAN ADMINISTRATION

The Navajo Nation Council hereby approves the administration of the Sihasin Ganado Fire District Emergency Vehicle Expenditure Plan as follows:

A. The Navajo Nation Controller shall determine whether the source of the \$2,644,380 allocation from the Sihasin Fund will be from Fund Principal or Fund Income or a combination of both.

- B. The funds allocated for the Ganado Fire District Emergency Vehicle Expenditure Plan shall be distributed to the Division of Community Development within twenty (20) days following enactment of this legislation.
- C. Upon receipt of the \$2,644,380 in Sihasin funds, the Division of Community Development shall promptly purchase the emergency vehicles listed in Exhibit C and arrange for delivery of the vehicles, and transfer of vehicle titles, to the Ganado Fire District.
- D. Ganado Fire District shall be responsible for the operation, maintenance, and repairs of the emergency vehicles, and shall obtain appropriate liability and other insurance covering use of the emergency vehicles. The Navajo Nation shall not be liable for any condition or event pertaining to the emergency vehicles.
- E. The funds allocated for the Ganado Fire District Emergency Vehicle Expenditure Plan shall be used solely to purchase the emergency vehicles described in Exhibit C and any and all costsavings shall be returned to the Sihasin Fund once the Ganado Fire District Emergency Vehicle Expenditure Plan is completed.
- F. The funds allocated for the Ganado Fire District Emergency Vehicle Expenditure Plan shall revert to the Sihasin Fund principal if not spent or encumbered within ninety (90) days of distribution to the Division of Community Development, unless recommended otherwise by the Resources and Development Committee and approved by the Naabik'iyati' Committee.
- G. The Sihasin Fund shall be reimbursed, in the full amount allocated in this legislation, from prospective funds available to the Navajo Nation from any and all state and federal sources, including Congressional appropriations under the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 or other COVID-19-related relief.

SECTION FIVE. EFFECTIVE DATE

This legislation and the Síhasin Ganado Fire District Emergency Vehicle Expenditure Plan shall become effective pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 2505.

SECTION SIX. SAVING CLAUSE

Should any provision(s) of this Action be determined invalid by the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, or the District Courts of the Navajo Nation without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, the remainder of this Action shall remain the law of the Navajo Nation.

SECTION SEVEN. DIRECTIVES

The Division of Community Development shall provide a written report on the status of expenditures and project progress under the Sihasin Ganado Fire District Emergency Vehicle Expenditure Plan to the Naabik'iyati' Committee, and to the Office of the President and Vice-President, by the fifth day of each month following the enactment of this legislation.

Delegate James,

The Division of Community Development (DCD) is requesting an extension on Resolution CO-53-21. The original language under Section 4(F) gave DCD ninety (90) days to spend or encumber the funds. A Purchase Order (PO# 411478) was issued on the 90th day, February 15, 2022.

Due to the term identified in the resolution, the Business Unit number was set up as a fiscal year business unit which led to the business unit expiring at the end of fiscal year 2022. The Business Unit, BU#: 415004, no longer shows available funds and our Purchase Order (PO) was canceled. The Office of the Controller (OOC) issues a memo every year in the summer for fiscal year end closing timelines which notifies departments when to submit for payment so that PO's are not canceled. A memo was submitted to OOC requesting for the Purchase Order to carry over into the next fiscal year, however, the expiring Business Unit had no funds to encumber against.

The reason for pursuing a Purchase Order, rather than a contract, is because we are only purchasing vehicles. The purchase of vehicles is deemed as goods under the Navajo Nation Procurement Rules and Regulations under Section II (E). If a service was being provided along with the purchase of the vehicles, then we'd need a contract.

This extension will allow for the use of the funds under Resolution CO-53-21. A new purchase order will be requested from the Office of the Controller which will allow DCD to make the payment after the delivery of the six (6) Fire Trucks and two (2) Ambulances. The expected delivery by Velocity Fire Equipment is expected to happen before September 30, 2023. Our recommended extension is to March 31, 2024.

A. DELIVERY. Delivery must be made within thirty (30) days from receipt of this purchase order unless otherwise specified. Time is of the essence and if goods are not delivered within the time specified, the Navajo Nation may reject such goods and cancel the order. Acceptance of later or defective deliveries shall not be deemed a waiver by the Navajo Nation of its right to cancel this order or to refuse to accept further deliveries. The purchase order number, account and project numbers must be shown on all packages, packing slips, invoices and correspondence relating to the order. BACKORDERS WILL BE ALLOWED ONLY UPON AGREEMENT WITH THE PURCHASING DEPARTMENT.

B. F.O.B POINT. All prices offered herein are F.O.B. destination (on the Navajo Reservation) unless otherwise specified.

- C. REQUIREMENT FOR WRITTEN PURCHASE ORDER. Shipments will not be accepted and invoices will not be honored unless a valid purchase order in writing, has been issued to the vendor by the Purchasing Section of the Navajo Nation.
- D. TERMS AND ACCEPTANCE. This order becomes a contract (I) when a signed acknowledgment is received by the Navajo Nation, or (2) when shipment according to schedule of all or any portion of the goods covered by this order shall be made, or (3) when written approval is given vendor by the Navajo Nation of the price and delivery schedule of the goods as stated by vendor if vendor's written acknowledgment of this order contains either (a) a different price or delivery schedule or a different type of item, or (b) no price or no delivery schedule for the item or items to which the Navajo Nation's approval applies. Except as provided in the preceding sentence, a condition of this order is that any provisions printed or otherwise contained in any acknowledgment of this order, inconsistent with or in addition to the terms and conditions herein stated, and any alteration in this purchase order, shall have no force or effect, and that the vendor by such acknowledgment thereby agrees that any such provision therein or any such alteration in this order shall not constitute any part of this contract of purchase and sale. This contract contains the entire agreement of the parties, and failure of either party to enforce any of its rights hereunder shall not constitute a waiver of such rights or of any other rights hereunder.

E. BILLING.

1. Submit original invoice(s) and 2 copies to the Accounts Payable Section. The Navajo Nation, P.O. Drawer 1660, Window Rock, AZ 86515. DUPLICATE INVOICES WILL NOT BE HONORED.

2. Invoicing must be itemized as to items, quantities, unit prices and extended amounts.

3. Submit a separate invoice for each purchase order. Do not combine invoicing for more than one purchase order.

4. Invoices must be submitted immediately upon shipment.

- 5. Where pricing differences or discrepancies exist between the purchase order and the invoice submitted, the purchase order will prevail. The purchaser reserves the right to accept or reject all quantities delivered not in compliance with the purchase order specifications or in excess of the quantities specified herein.
- F. CASH DISCOUNT. The term of any cash discount will be computed from the date of receipt and acceptance of the goods or services procured hereunder, or from the date of receipt of a correct Original invoice, whichever is later.
- G. TAXES. Except as may be otherwise provided in this order, the contract price includes all applicable federal, state, Indian and local taxes. In addition, the Navajo Nation claims the transaction is in any event immune from state and local sales, gross receipts, use, compensating and transaction privilege taxes under federal Indian law. Vendor expressly warrants that the contract price does include any allowance for state and local sales, gross receipts, use, compensating and transaction privilege taxes. The Navajo Nation will not reimburse or pay vendor any state and local sales, gross receipts, use, compensating and transaction privilege taxes unless the following conditions are met:
 - 1. A governmental authority asserts a liability for such taxes against vendor has not and will not concede its liability for such taxes except as provided in Paragraph G.3(below); and
 - 2. The Navajo Nation at its expense is given the full opportunity to contest the liability for such taxes for and on behalf of vendor and with vendor's full cooperation; and
 - 3. A final determination has been made that vendor is liable for such taxes or the Navajo Nation decides it does not wish to contest vendor's liability for such taxes further.
- H. FAIR LABOR STANDARDS ACT. Vendor must certify that goods were produced in compliance with all applicable requirements of section 6,7 and 12 of the Fair Labor Standards Act, as amended, and of regulations and orders of the United States Department of Labor issued under section 14 thereof.
- I. NAVAJO PREFERENCE. If this purchase order is issued to a vendor claiming preference under the Navajo Nation Business Preference Law, then acknowledgment and/or delivery against this order shall constitute certification of current compliance, on the part of the vendor, with all applicable provisions of this Law.

J. CHOICE OF LAW. The laws of the Navajo Nation will govern the interpretation, construction and enforcement of this Purchase Order, including, without limitation, the Navajo Uniform Commercial Code.

- K. CHOICE OF FORUM. Subject to the limits of applicable law, eg., 1. Navajo Tribe Code et seq., any dispute between the parties will be resolved in the Courts of the Navajo Nation and vendor consents to in necessary jurisdiction of such courts in the event of any such dispute.
- L. INSPECTION, WARRANTY. Goods or services delivered (whether paid for or not) are subject to inspection, testing, and approval by the Navajo Nation before acceptance. Vendor expressly warrants that all articles, materials, services and work will conform to the applicable drawings, specifications, samples or other descriptions given in all respects. Vendor further expressly warrants that the goods or services delivered hereunder will be of good quality, material and workmanship, merchantable and free from defects. The warranty shall survive any inspection, delivery, acceptance or payment by vendor of the goods or services.

M. OTHER As used herein, the titles "the Navajo Tribe" and "the Navajo Nation" are synonymous.
