TITLE OF RESOLUTION: AN ACTION RELATING TO THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE; AMENDING NABIN-36-22, ESTABLISHING THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' MISSING AND MURDERED DINÉ RELATIVES TASK FORCE

PURPOSE: This resolution, if approved, will amend NABIN-36-22, and add the Director of Criminal Investigation as a member of the MMDR Task Force.

This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committee. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each Council Delegate to review the proposed resolution in detail.

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17	SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY	
18	A. The Naabik'íyáti' Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council	
19	and is empowered to serve as the oversight committee for task forces under the	
20	Legislative Branch of the Navajo Nation government, unless otherwise designated by	
21	Navajo Nation law, and to approve and amend the plans of operation thereof. 2 N.N.C.	
22	§§ 700(A) and 701(A)(5).	
23	B. The Naabik'íyáti' Committee is also empowered to coordinate all federal, county and	
24	state programs with other standing committees and branches of the Navajo Nation	
25	government to provide the most effective delivery of services to the Navajo Nation. 2	
26	N.N.C. § 701(A)(4).	
27	C. The Naabik'íyáti' Committee is further empowered with the authority to delegate its	
28	authority as appropriate for efficiency and streamlining of government process to	
29	appropriate entities. 2 N.N.C. § 701(B).	
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SECTION TWO, FINDINGS

- A. Resolution NABIN-36-22, attached as **Exhibit A**, established the Missing and Murdered Diné Relatives Task Force and requires amendments to be approved by the Naabik'íyáti' Committee.
- B. The Navajo Nation established the Missing and Murdered Diné Relatives ("MMDR") Task Force to coordinate a dynamic holistic approach to help combat the missing and murdered Diné Relatives crises on and off the Navajo Nation with representatives from all three Branches of the Navajo Nation government, as well as community member representatives.
- C. Currently, the MMDR Task Force consists of twelve members who regularly meet twice a month.
- D. The MMDR Task Force is delegated the authority to implement and accomplish the following:
 - 1. The MMDR Task Force shall conduct a study to determine how to increase resources for reporting and identifying missing and murdered Diné relatives on and off the Navajo Nation.
 - 2. The MMDR Task Force shall collaborate with programs, departments and entities within the Navajo Nation and federal and state agencies to determine the scope of the missing and murdered Diné relatives crisis, identify barriers to address the crisis and create partnerships to improve the reporting of and the investigation of missing and murdered Diné relatives.
 - 3. The MMDR Task Force may collaborate with programs and departments within the state and federal government to improve MMDR's processes for information sharing and coordination of resources regarding reporting and investigating cases of missing and murdered Diné relatives.
 - 4. The MMDR Task Force shall report its findings and recommendations to the Naabik'íyáti' Committee and the Office of the President and Vice-President at the end of the second and fourth quarters of each Navajo Nation fiscal year.

E. The amendment to Resolution NABIN-36-22 proposed herein changes the membership of the MMDR Task Force from twelve to thirteen members, adding the Director of Criminal Investigation as a member to assist in implementing and accomplishing the purposes of the Task Force.

SECTION THREE. AMENDMENT TO NABIN-36-22

The Navajo Nation hereby amends NABIMY-32-15 as follows:

SECTION THREE. ESTABSLISHING THE MISSING AND MURDERED DINÉ RELATIVES TASK FORCE

- A. The MMDR Task Force shall consist of twelve thirteen (1312) members as follows:
 - 1. A representative of the Naabik'íyáti' Committee of the Navajo Nation Council;
 - 2. A representative from the Health, Education and Human Services Committee of the Navajo Nation Council;
 - 3. A representative from the Law and Order Committee of the Navajo Nation Council;
 - 4. A representative from the Office of the Speaker selected by the Speaker of the Navajo Nation Council;
 - 5. A representative from the Office of the President and Vice-President selected by the President of the Navajo Nation;
 - 6. A representative from the Navajo Nation Judicial Branch selected by the Chief Justice of the Navajo Nation;
 - 7. The Chief of the Navajo Nation Police Department or their designee;
 - 8. The Chief Prosecutor of the Navajo Nation or their designee;
 - 9. The Chief Public Defender or their designee; and
 - 10. The Director of Criminal Investigations or their designee; and
 - 11. Three representatives from Navajo communities who have extensive experience and knowledge of missing and murdered Diné relatives. Such

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community representatives shall be selected by a majority of the MMDR Task Force.

SECTION FOUR. APPROVING THE AMENDMENT TO NABIN-36-22

The Navajo Nation hereby approves the amendment to NABIN-36-22, *Establishing the Naabik'íyáti' Missing and Murdered Diné Relatives Task Force*, to add the Director of Criminal Investigations.

SECTION FIVE. EFFECTIVE DATE

The provisions of this legislation shall become effective in accordance with 2 N.N.C. § 221(C).
