TITLE OF RESOLUTION: AN ACTION RELATING TO THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE AND NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; AMENDING NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL RESOLUTION NO. CJN-29-22 TO INCLUDE ADDITIONAL U.S. DEPARTMENT OF TREASURY FISCAL RECOVERY FUNDS EXPENDITURE CATEGORIES; WAIVING NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL APPROVAL AND AUTHORIZING ADMINISTRATIVE APPROVAL OF AMENDMENTS TO THE NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUND BATHROOM ADDITIONS EXPENDITURE PLAN TO INCLUDE ADDITIONAL EXPENDITURE CATEGORIES

PURPOSE: If adopted, this legislation will expand the eligible uses of the NNFRF Bathroom Additions Expenditure Plan to include bathroom renovations.

This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committees. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each Council Delegate to review each proposed resolution in detail.

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23	SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY	
24	A. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing body of the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C.	
25	§ 102 (A).	
26	B. The Naabik'íyáti' Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council	
27	with the delegated responsibility to hear proposed resolution(s) that require final	
28	action by the Navajo Nation Council. 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(9).	
29	C. Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CJN-29-22, attached as Exhibit 1 (exhibits	
30	not included), mandates that any amendments to CJN-29-22 be duly "adopted by a	
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two-thirds (2/3) vote of all members of the Navajo Nation Council and approved by the President of the Navajo Nation pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164 (A) and 2 N.N.C. §§ 1005 (C) (10), (11), and (12)." CJN-29-22, Section Seventeen.

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- A. The Navajo Nation's acceptance of federal Fiscal Recovery Funds ("FRF") obligates the Navajo Nation to comply with federal laws and regulations, including the U.S. Department of Treasury's Compliance and Reporting Guidance for State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds. *See* CJN-29-22, Section Two (J).
- B. The U.S. Department of Treasury has issued guidance requiring that the use and expenditure of Fiscal Recovery Funds must fall under one of the four categories above and that funding recipients must report each expenditure under one of the eighty-three (83) "Expenditure Categories" set forth in Appendix 1 to the U.S. Department of Treasury's Compliance and Reporting Guidance for State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds which is incorporated herein by reference.
- C. The Navajo Nation's current Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Funds ("NNFRF") expenditure authorization and approval process for the allocation of funds from the NNFRF as set forth in Navajo Nation Council Resolutions Nos. CJN-29-22, Exhibit 1, (exhibits not included) and CJY-41-21, attached as Exhibit 2 (exhibits not included), mandates that NNFRF Expenditure Plans be adopted by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of all members of the Navajo Nation Council and approved by the President of the Navajo Nation pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164 (A) and 2 N.N.C. §§ 1005 (C) (10), (11), and (12). CJN-29-22, Section One (B) and Section Seventeen.
- D. The NNFRF Bathroom Additions Expenditure Plan approved by CJN-29-22, attached herein as Exhibit 3, only authorizes Bathroom Addition projects falling under Expenditure Category 1.14 (Other Public Health Services) which has limited or restricted the extent of otherwise eligible FRF Bathroom Addition projects.
- E. The expansion of the NNFRF Bathroom Additions Expenditure Plan to include
 Expenditure Categories 5.3 and 5.5 shall authorize the use of NNFRF funding for
 bathroom additions, as well as for bathroom renovations.

SECTION THREE. AMENDING NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL RESOLUTION CJN-29-22 TO ADD EXPENDITURE CATERGORIES 5.3 AND 5.5 TO THE NNFRF BATHROOM ADDITIONS EXPENDITURE PLAN

The Navajo Nation Council hereby amends Section Eleven, Subsection (B)(1) of Navajo Nation Council Resolution CJN-29-22, as follows:

One hundred fifty million dollars (\$150,000,000) to the Division of Community Development for Bathroom Additions, as Other Public Health Services (Expenditure Category 1.14), <u>Decentralized Wastewater (Expenditure Category 5.3), and/or Other Sewer Infrastructure (Expenditure Category 5.5)</u> as set forth in Exhibit M, with administrative oversight by the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Funds Office and legislative oversight by the Resources and Development Committee.

SECTION FOUR. WAIVING NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL APPROVAL OF AMENDMENTS TO THE NNFRF BATHROOM ADDITIONS EXPENDITURE PLAN TO INCORPORATE EXPENDITURE CATEGORIES 5.3 AND 5.5

A. The Navajo Nation Council hereby waives any and all provisions of Navajo Nation Council Resolution Nos. CJY-41-21 and CJN-29-22 that require amendments to the NNFRF Bathroom Additions Expenditure Plan, CJY-41-21 Exhibits M and M-1, be approved by the Navajo Nation Council and enacted pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164 (A)(17) and 2 N.N.C. §§ 1005 (C)(10), (11), and (12).

 B. Amendments to the Bathroom Additions Expenditure Plan, CJY-41-21 Exhibits M and M-1, to incorporate Decentralized Wastewater (Expenditure Category 5.3), and/or Other Sewer Infrastructure (Expenditure Category 5.5) shall be approved administratively by the President of the Navajo Nation.

C. The waiver of Navajo Nation Council approval of amendments to the Bathroom Additions Expenditure Plan, CJY-41-21 Exhibits M and M-1, shall only extend to the incorporation of Decentralized Wastewater (Expenditure Category 5.3), and/or Other Sewer Infrastructure (Expenditure Category 5.5).

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SECTION FIVE. SAVING CLAUSE

Should any provision(s) of this Action be determined invalid by the Navajo Nation Supreme Court or the District Courts of the Navajo Nation, without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, the remainder of the Action shall remain the law of the Navajo Nation.

SECTION SIX. EFFECTIVE DATE

The provisions of this Action shall become effective upon adoption by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of all members of the Navajo Nation Council and approval of the President of the Navajo Nation pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164 (A)(17) and 2 N.N.C. §§ 1005 (C)(10), (11), and (12).

SECTION SEVEN. DIRECTIVES

A. The Division of Community Development, Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Office, and Department of Justice are to work collaboratively to revise the NNFRF Bathroom Addition Expenditure Plan, CJN-29-22 Exhibits M and M-1, to add incorporate Decentralized Wastewater (Expenditure Category 5.3), and Other Sewer Infrastructure (Expenditure Category 5.5) and expeditiously submit the revised Bathroom Addition Expenditure Plan to the Office of President and Vice-President for President approval.

B. Once the President has approved the revised Bathroom Addition Expenditure Plan, the Division of Community and Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Office shall ensure that the revised Bathroom Addition Expenditure Plan is appropriately published, including posting on the NNFRF website and distribution to Navajo Nation Chapters and Council Delegates.

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
