PURPOSE OF THIS LEGISLATION:

to approve the Navajo Nation's support of the establishment of the federal Commission for the "Baaj Nwaavjo I'tah Kukveni-Ancestral Footprints of the Grand Canyon National Monument" and to confirm the appointment of Richard M. Begay as the Navajo Nation's representative on the Commission.

FINAL AUTHORITY and VOTE REQUIREMENT:

The Naabik'íyáti' Committee has final authority. A simple majority vote of the Committee is required to approve the resolution.

20	SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY	
21	A. Pursuant to President Joseph R. Biden's Proclamation No. 10606 dated August 8, 2023, the	
22	federal government established the "Baaj Nwaavjo I'tah Kukveni-Ancestral Footprints of	
23	the Grand Canyon National Monument." EXHIBIT A.	
24	B. Also pursuant to the Proclamation, a tribal member Commission was established "to provide	
25	guidance and recommendations on the development and implementation of the management	
26	plan [for the Monument] and on the management of the monument." As a tribal nation with	
27	ancestral ties to the Monument, the Navajo Nation is permitted to appoint a Navajo Nation	
28	tribal member to the Commission.

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- A. The interconnected landscapes of the Grand Canyon region, including the Colorado River, Glen Canyon, Marble Canyon, the Grand Canyon, and various sites throughout the boundaries of the Baai Nwaavjo I'tah Kukveni-Ancestral Footprints of the Grand Canyon National Monument, form an essential part of the Navajo People's oral histories and ceremonies.
- B. The Commission established by Proclamation No. 10606 is tasked with developing and implementing a management plan for the Monument, thereby equipping the affected tribes with a greater voice in protecting this sacred landscape from potential harms, including the expansion of uranium mining, a practice known to have devasted the Navajo People for decades.
- C. The Commission also allows tribal input in the creation of interpretative materials, recruitment initiatives, ethnographic studies, and the establishment of a museum/visitor center at the Monument.
- D. Currently, the Navajo Nation actively participates in the Glen Canyon Adaptive Management Program and already collaborates with federal agencies to protect cultural and natural resources in the area.
- E. Richard M. Begay has demonstrated exceptional dedication and expertise in the fields of anthropology, historic preservation, and cultural resources management, as evidenced by his extensive educational background and professional experience.
- F. Mr. Begay has a distinguished career, including his current role as the Department Manager of the Navajo Nation Heritage and Historic Preservation Department, where he effectively manages operations, develops budgets, and oversees programs related to the protection and preservation of the Navajo Nation's cultural resources.
- G. Richard M. Begay's background includes significant contributions to various organizations, such as his role as the Director of Historic Preservation for the Agua Caliente Band of Cahuilla Indians in Palm Springs, California, and his involvement in the USDA Natural

Resources Conservation	Service,	where he	served	as a	Natural	Resource	Specialist/Tribal
Liaison.							

- H. Mr. Begay's academic achievements, including an Ed. M. from Harvard University with a concentration in Human Development & Psychology and a focus on the Acquisition of Language and Culture, demonstrate his commitment to advancing knowledge and understanding in relevant fields.
- I. Richard M. Begay has authored and co-authored publications, including "Grand Canyon in the Navajo Lifeway" and "An Exploration of Navajo-Anasazi Relationships," which showcase his expertise and dedication to sharing the cultural heritage and history of the Navajo People.
- J. Navajo Nation President Buu Nygren has appointed Richard M. Begay as the Navajo Nation's representative on the Commission for the Baaj Nwaavjo I'tah Kukveni-Ancestral Footprints of the Grand Canyon National Monument. **EXHIBIT B**.

SECTION THREE. APPROVING THE NAVAJO NATION'S SUPPORT OF THE COMMISSION FOR THE "BAAJ NWAAVJO I'TAH KUKVENI-ANCESTRAL FOOTPRINTS OF THE GRAND CANYON" NATIONAL MONUMENT

The Navajo Nation hereby supports President Joseph R. Biden's Proclamation No. 10606 and the establishment of the tribal member Commission for the Baaj Nwaavjo I'tah Kukveni-Ancestral Footprints of the Grand Canyon National Monument.

SECTION FOUR. CONFIRMING THE APPOINTMENT OF RICHARD M. BEGAY AS THE NAVAJO NATION'S REPRESENTATIVE ON THE COMMISSION

A. The Naabik'íyáti' Committee hereby confirms the Navajo Nation President's appointment of Richard M. Begay as the Navajo Nation's representative on the federal Commission for the "Baaj Nwaavjo I'tah Kukveni-Ancestral Footprints of the Grand Canyon National Monument." As the Navajo Nation's representative, Mr. Begay will carry out all responsibilities as a Commission member, and by the end of every Quarter Mr. Begay will

provide a written report to the Naabik'íyáti' Committee regarding the Commission's activities and accomplishments.

B. In accordance with the requirements of Proclamation No. 10606, the Navajo Nation hereby expresses its intent to join the Commission by entering into a cooperative agreement or similar arrangement with the U.S. Secretary of Interior and the U.S. Secretary of Agriculture, through the U.S. Bureau of Land Management or the U.S. Forest Service, whereby the Navajo Nation and the federal agencies shall agree to co-stewardship of the Baaj Nwaavjo I'tah Kukveni-Ancestral Footprints of the Grand Canyon National Monument through shared responsibilities or administration.

SECTION FIVE. DIRECTIVE

This Resolution shall be transmitted to all appropriate parties, including the Baaj Nwaavjo I'tah Kukveni–Ancestral Footprints of the Grand Canyon Commission, the Navajo Nation President, and any relevant federal agencies or entities, to formalize the Navajo Nation's intent to join the Baaj Nwaavjo I'tah Kukveni–Ancestral Footprints of the Grand Canyon Commission and its appointment of Richard M. Begay as the Navajo Nation's representative on the Commission.

SECTION SIX. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Action shall be effective pursuant to 2 N.N.C. §221(C) and 2 N.N.C. §701(A)(1).

SECTION SEVEN. SAVING CLAUSE

If any part of this Action is invalidated by the Supreme Court of the Navajo Nation, or by any Navajo Nation District Court without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, the remainder of this Action shall be the law of the Navajo Nation.
