TITLE OF RESOLUTION: AN ACT RELATING TO THE HEALTH, EDUCATION, AND HUMAN SERVICES COMMITTEE, THE LAW AND ORDER COMMITTEE, THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE, AND THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; AMENDING TITLE 2 OF THE NAVAJO NATION CODE, THE PLAN OF OPERATION FOR THE NAVAJO NATION YOUTH ADVISORY COUNCIL, FROM THE EXECUTIVE BRANCH TO THE LEGISLATIVE BRANCH

PURPOSE: The purpose of this proposed resolution is to approve an amended Plan of Operation for the Navajo Nation Youth Advisory Council that places the program under the Legislative Branch.

Final Authority: Navajo Nation Council

Vote Required: A 2/3 vote is required.

This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committees. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each Council Delegate to review each proposed resolution in detail.

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20	SECTION 1. AUTHORITY	
21	A. The Health, Education, and Human Services Committee is a standing committee of the	
22	Navajo Nation Council with authority over proposed resolutions on matters involving	
23	social services, health, environmental health, education, veterans, employment, and	
24	labor. 2 N.N.C. §§ 164(A) and 401(B)(6)(a)	
25	B. The Law and Order Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council	
26	with authority over proposed resolutions that amend, or enact new provisions to, the	
27	Navajo Nation Code. 2 N.N.C. §§ 164(A) and 601(B)(14).	
28	C. The Naabik'íyáti' Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council with	
29	authority over proposed resolutions that require final action by the Navajo Nation	
30	Council. 2 N.N.C. §§ 164(A)(9) and 701(A)(3).	

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The Navajo Nation Council is the governing body of the Navajo Nation. The Navajo D. Nation Council reviews and approves amendments and enactments to the Navajo Nation Code. 2 N.N.C. §§ 102(A) and 164(A).

SECTION 2. FINDINGS

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- On April 19, 2017, the Navajo Nation Council by Resolution CAP-26-17 established the A. Navajo Nation Youth Advisory Council within 2 N.N.C. §§ 1160 - 1165. EXHIBIT 1.
- Resolution CAP-26-17 placed the Navajo Nation Youth Advisory Council under the B. Navajo Nation Executive Branch, with the Office of the President/Vice-President. The Office of the President/Vice President is charged with coordinating its efforts with the Judicial Branch and the Legislative Branch to provide technical assistance and other support to the Navajo Nation Youth Advisory Council.
- It is recommended that the Navajo Nation Youth Advisory Council be moved from the C. Executive Branch to the Legislative Branch for better efficiency.
- The Navajo Nation finds it in the best interest of the Navajo Nation and the Navajo youth D. that the Navajo Nation Youth Advisory Council be moved from the Executive Branch to the Legislative Branch.

SECTION 3. APPROVING AMENDMENTS TO TITLE 2 OF THE NAVAJO NATION CODE REGARDING THE NAVAJO NATION YOUTH ADVISORY COUNCIL

The Navajo Nation hereby amends the Navajo Nation Youth Advisory Council plan of operation by deleting 2 N.N.C. §§ 1160 - 1165, and approving 2 N.N.C. §§ 890 - 897, as follows:

1	§ 1160. ESTABLISHMENT
2	The Navajo Nation Youth Advisory Council is established under the Executive Branch of the
3	Navajo Nation Government. The Office of the President and Vice-President shall-coordinate
4	technical assistance and support with the Judicial and Legislative Branches.
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6	§ 1161. PURPOSES
7	The purposes of the Navajo Nation-Youth Advisory Council shall include:
8	A. Providing policy advice to the President and Vice-President of the Navajo Nation
9	the Navajo Nation Council and the Judicial Branch of the Navajo Nation Governmen
10	regarding youth-issues and concerns.
11	B. Identifying issues facing Navajo Nation Youth, and providing guidance and
12	offering solutions to Navajo Nation officials concerning such issues.
13	C. Recommending amendments to its enabling legislation or Policies and
14	Procedures.
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16	§1162. PERSONNEL
17	The Navajo Nation Youth Advisory Council is established under the Executive Branch of the
18	Navajo Nation Government. The Office of the President and Vice-President shall coordinate
19	technical assistance and support with the Judicial and Legislative Branches.
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21	§1163. ORGANIZATION
22	A. A Navajo Nation Youth Advisory Council shall consist of twelve (12) members
23	There shall be two (2) members appointed from each of the five Agencies. Two (2) members
24	shall be appointed at large.
25	B. The Youth Advisory Council shall be recommended by the Office of Diné Youth
26	and appointed by the President, Speaker and Chief Justice.
27	C. The terms of the membership shall be two years.
28	D. The Youth Advisory Council-shall select from its members a Chair, Vice-Chair
29	Secretary and Treasurer.
30	E. Youth Advisory Council members shall be 14 to 24 years old.

1	F. The Navajo Nation-Youth Advisory Council shall meet on a quarterly basis and
2	as necessary. Designated members shall receive meals and travel expense reimbursement
3	pursuant to the Navajo Nation laws, policies and procedures.
4	G. The Youth Advisory Council-shall-give a quarterly-report to the President and
5	Vice-President of the Navajo Nation, Navajo Nation Council at the regular Navajo Nation
6	Council session, and Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Navajo Nation.
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8	§1164. LEGISLATIVE OVERSIGHT
9	The Navajo Nation Youth Advisory Council shall operate under the oversight of the Health,
10	Education and Human Services Committee of the Navajo Nation Council.
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12	§1165. AMENDMENTS
13	This enabling legislation for the Navajo Nation Youth Advisory Council may be amended by
14	the Navajo Nation Council.

22	§ 890. Establishment.
23	The Navajo Nation hereby established the Navajo Nation Youth Advisory Council ("Youth
24	Advisory Council") within the Legislative Branch as an entity of the Navajo Nation
25	government.
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27	§ 891. Purposes.
28	The purposes of the Youth Advisory Council shall include:
29	A. providing policy recommendations to appropriate programs and departments
30	within the Legislative, Judicial, and Executive Branches of the Navajo Nation Government.

regarding issues and concerns affecting the Navajo youth;

- B. serving as a forum for the presentation and exchange of ideas and goals for the benefit of the Navajo youth, and offering relevant proposals to Tribal, State, Federal, and International governments and organizations, and to public and private entities;
- C. receiving reports, and performing advocacy, regarding matters affecting the Navajo youth and their families;
- D. providing leadership opportunities to the Navajo youth by providing safe and healthy guidance and mentorship;
- E. promoting Navajo culture, language, and the philosophy of Nitsakakees, Nahat'a, <u>Iiná</u>, and Síhasin, through K'é, in harmony with Diné Fundamental Law, inclusive of other philosophies, as appropriate; and
- F. recommending amendments to its plan of operation and relevant policies and procedures affecting Navajo Youth.

§ 892. Staffing and Organization.

- A. Staffing. There is established the position of Executive Director of the Youth Advisory Council. The Executive Director shall be under the general direction of the Youth Advisory Council, subject to the Navajo Nation Personnel Policies Manual. The Executive Director shall be authorized to oversee the daily operations of the Youth Advisory Council, coordinate hearings, analyze data, write reports, and submit findings to the Youth Advisory Council, the Naabik'íyáti' Committee, and the Navajo Nation Council. The Executive Director shall supervise the office staff to ensure timely completion of established operational goals. All personnel shall be employed and compensated in accordance with the Navajo Nation Personnel Policies Manual.
- B. Organization. The Youth Advisory Council shall consist of 12 Members, who all must be enrolled members of the Navajo Nation and must be ages 14 years to 24 years old. Two members shall be appointed from each of the five Navajo Nation Agencies, and two "at large" members shall be appointed by the Speaker.
- C. Confirmation. Each of the 12 members shall be confirmed by the Naabik'iyati'
 Committee.

E. Leadership. Members shall select a leadership model to govern meetings and other activities of the Youth Advisory Council, which model shall incorporate Diné fundamental law and K'é traditional principles.

F. Chair and Vice-Chair. A Chair shall be selected to schedule and conduct official meetings. The Chair shall not vote on any resolution before the Youth Advisory Council, unless such vote is needed to break a tie vote. A Vice-Chair shall also be selected to perform the Chair's duties whenever the Chair is unavailable or has a conflict regarding a particular matter before the Youth Advisory Council. When serving in the place of the Chair, the Vice-Chair shall not vote on any resolution before the Youth Advisory Council, unless such vote is needed to break a tie vote.

G. Resignation. Any Member may resign at any time by giving a two-week advance written notice to the Youth Advisory Council.

§ 893. Meetings and Procedures.

A. Meetings. The Youth Advisory Council shall conduct a Regular Meeting at least once per month. At the written request of any member, at any time the Chair (or the Vice-Chair if the Chair is unavailable) may call and schedule a Special Meeting. As used herein, "meeting" or "all meetings" means both Regular Meetings and Special Meetings.

B. Attendance. All members are required to attend all meetings, either in person or by means of remote conferencing, unless excused by the Executive Director. A member's failure to attend three meetings consecutively (including Regular Meetings and Special Meetings), without being excused by the Executive Director, shall result in automatic removal from the Youth Advisory Council.

C. Quorum. Seven members of the Youth Advisory Council shall constitute a quorum, and all meetings shall be conducted only when a quorum is present. A quorum must be maintained at all times for the duration of all meetings, and the Chair (or Vice-Chair if the Chair is unavailable) shall stop a meeting if a quorum is lost.

D. Voting and official action. Voting shall occur only at meetings with a quorum

present. Any official action of the Youth Advisory Council shall be by resolution approved by majority vote of the members in attendance and voting at the time. Proxy votes shall not be allowed at any time for any action of the Youth Advisory Council.

E. Meeting minutes. Draft minutes of all meetings shall be prepared within 10 calendar days after each meeting and shall be distributed to all members at least 10 working days before the next meeting. For all meetings, the minutes of the previous meeting shall be included on the Agenda for review or discussion at such meeting.

F. Public attendance. All meetings shall be open to public attendance, except when the Youth Advisory Council approves a confidential Executive Session during any meeting. All Executive Sessions must be approved by a majority vote of the members in attendance and voting at the time. Meeting notices shall be publicly posted on an appropriate website at least 24 hours prior to any meeting.

G. Public Participation. Any person wishing to present at any meeting shall notify the Executive Director in writing at least five business days prior to the time scheduled for the start of such meeting. Notification shall include the person's name, address, organization represented, and a brief explanation of the topic to be presented. The time allotted for presentation, including questions and/or further public comments, shall be determined by the Chair (or Vice-Chair if the Chair is unavailable).

§ 894. Compensation for Participation.

A. All Youth Advisory Council members are considered volunteers and shall receive no compensation for their participation, or activities related to, the Youth Advisory Council. However, members shall receive dollar-for-dollar reimbursements for their authorized and documented expenses incurred in the performance of their duties for the Youth Advisory Council.

B. Reimbursement shall be in accordance with current Navajo Nation travel policies and procedures. Reimbursement claims with sufficient documentation shall be submitted to the Executive Director, and the Office shall be responsible for paying members' reimbursement claims.

1	§ 895. Duties, Responsibilities, and Goals.
2	The Youth Advisory Council shall:
3	A. schedule and conduct Regular Meetings once per month, as well as Special
4	Meetings from time-to-time, as appropriate;
5	B. at least once per fiscal year quarter, provide written reports to the Naabik'íyáti'
6	Committee (and verbal reports if so requested), with copies provided to the Speaker and other
7	Navajo Nation programs, as appropriate;
8	C. in all activities and formal actions of the Youth Advisory Council, incorporate
9	K'é (kinship) and other Diné fundamental concepts and practices;
10	D. become knowledgeable and stay informed about matters relating to the Navajo
11	Nation and the Navajo youth;
12	E. maintain open and regular communication with appropriate government
13	programs and private entities, as appropriate, and provide relevant reports to appropriate
14	Navajo Nation Council Standing Committees regarding issues concerning the Navajo youth;
15	F. review proposed or pending legislation affecting the Navajo youth, and advocate
16	for new legislation to benefit the Navajo youth;
17	G. conduct public meetings and plan projects, programs, and/or services that will
18	benefit the Navajo youth; and
19	H. seek out and apply for funding for planned youth projects, programs, or services.
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21	§ 896. Legislative Oversight.
22	The Naabik'íyáti' Committee of the Navajo Nation Council shall have oversight authority over the
23	Youth Advisory Council.
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25	§ 897. Amendments.
26	This Plan of Operations may be amended by the Navajo Nation Council upon recommendation
27	of the Navajo Nation Youth Advisory Council and the Naabik'íyáti' Committee.
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1	SECTION 4. CODIFICATION
2	The parts of this Act that amend or adopt new sections of the Navajo Nation Code shall be
3	codified by the Office of Legislative Counsel. The Office of Legislative Counsel shall
4	incorporate such amended provisions in the next codification of the Navajo Nation Code.
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6	SECTION 5. SAVING CLAUSE
7	If any provision of this Act is determined invalid by final Order of the Navajo Nation Supreme
8	Court, or by final Order of a District Court of the Navajo Nation without appeal to the Navajo
9	Nation Supreme Court, the remainder of this Act shall be the law of the Navajo Nation.
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11	SECTION 6. EFFECTIVE DATE
12	The Navajo Nation Code amendments approved herein shall be effective pursuant to 2 N.N.C
13	§221(B) and 2 N.N.C. §1005(C)(10).
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
