**PURPOSE:** The purpose of this proposed resolution is to establish a minimum wage for Navajo Nation Government employees, effective as of October 1, 2025, with an annual COLA adjustment.

FINAL AUTHORITY: Navajo Nation Council

**VOTE REQUIRED:** Simple Majority

This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committees. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each Council Delegate to review each proposed resolution in detail.

- A. The Navajo Nation is a sovereign nation with authority to regulate wages paid to its 12 governmental employees. 13

D. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. §§ 164(A)(9) and 700(A), the Naabik'iyati Committee is a standing

committee of the Navajo Nation Council, and proposed resolution that requires final action

E. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. §§102 (A) and 164(A), the Navajo Nation Council is the "governing"

- 1. Federal Minimum Wage. The federal minimum wage is set forth in the Fair Labor Standards Act at \$7.25 per hour. There are also other federal laws, such as Davis-Bacon Act, Pub. L. 71–798, 46 Stat. 1494 that establish prevailing wages for contractors under federal contracts.
- 2. State of Arizona. Effective January 1, 2024, Arizona's minimum wage is \$14.35 per hour. In 2016, through a state ballot measure (Proposition 206 – Fair Wages and Healthy Families Act) the state minimum wage is to increase by annual indexing effective January 1<sup>st</sup> of each year. The annual increase is based on changes in the Consumer Price Index.
- 3. City of Flagstaff. Effective January 1, 2025, Flagstaff's minimum wage is \$17.85 per hour for non-tipped workers and \$16.85 per hour for tipped workers. In 2016, by Flagstaff ballot measure the minimum changes by an annual indexing beginning January 1, 2023.
- 4. State of New Mexico. Effective January 1, 2025, New Mexico's minimum wage is \$12.65 per hour. In 2019, by state legislation, the minimum wage increased in 2022 to \$11.50 and in 2023 to \$12.00, effective January 1st. Albuquerque, Bernalillo County, Las Cruces Santa Fe City, and Santa Fe County have separate minimum wages.

- 5. State of Utah. As of January 1, 2025, Utah's minimum wage is \$7.25 per hour.
- 6. State of Colorado. Effective January 1, 2025, Colorado's minimum wage is \$14.81 per hour. The annual increase is based on changes in the Consumer Price Index. Denver has a separate minimum wage.
- C. It is in the best interest of the Navajo Nation government and the Navajo People to establish a minimum wage for the Navajo Nation government and its employees.

# SECTION THREE. AMENDING THE NAVAJO PREFERENCE IN EMPLOYMENT ACT TO ESTABLISH A NAVAJO NATION GOVERNMENT MINIMUM WAGE

The Navajo Nation Code, at 15 N.N.C. §607, is hereby amended as follows:

#### Title 15. Labor

#### Chapter 3. Navajo Preference in Employment Act

§607. Navajo prevailing wage

- E. Navajo Nation Government Minimum Wage.
  - 1. Minimum Wage established. The Navajo Nation Government shall pay its employees no less than the Navajo Nation Minimum Wage, which shall be at the rate of \$14.70 per hour for each Regular Employee paid on an hourly basis, and for each Temporary Employee paid on an hourly basis.
  - 2. Hourly rate. The \$14.70/hour rate shall be effective as of October 1, 2025.
  - 3. Annual COLA. The minimum wage shall be increased on October 1 of each Navajo Nation Fiscal Year, starting as of October 1, 2026, by an amount equivalent to the increase in the cost of living. The increase in the cost of living shall be measured by the percentage increase of the immediately preceding year over the level as of the previous year of the consumer price index (all urban consumers, U.S. city average for all items) or its successor index as published by the U.S. Department of Labor or its successor agency.

with the amount of the minimum wage increase rounded to the nearest multiple of five cents.

4. Tipped employees. For any employee who customarily and regularly receives tips or gratuities from patrons or others, the Navajo Nation government may pay a wage up to \$3.00 per hour less than the minimum wage if the Navajo Nation government can establish by its records of charged tips or by the employee's declaration for federal insurance contributions act ("FICA") purposes that for each week, when adding tips received to wages paid, the employee received not less than the minimum wage for all hours worked. Compliance with this provision will be determined by averaging tips received by the Navajo Nation government over the course of the employer's payroll period or any other period selected by the Navajo Nation that complies with regulations adopted by the Health, Education and Human Services Committee.

#### SECTION FIVE. CODIFICATION

The amendments to the Navajo Nation Code approved herein shall be codified by the Office of Legislative Counsel. The Office of Legislative Counsel shall incorporate such amendments in the next codification of the Navajo Nation Code.

#### SECTION SIX. SAVING CLAUSE.

If any part of this Act is determined invalid by the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, or by a District Court of the Navajo Nation without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, the remainder of the Act shall remain the law of the Navajo Nation.
