21	SECTION ONE. AUTHORITIES	
22	Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 500 (B) (2), the Resources and Development Committee of	
23	the Navajo Nation Council has the authority to grant final approval for all land	
24	withdrawals, non-mineral leases, permits, licenses, right-of-way, surface easements	
25	and bonding requirements on Navajo Nation lands and unrestricted (fee) land. This	
26	authority shall include subleases, modifications, assignments, leasehold	
· 27	encumbrances, transfers, renewals, and terminations.

29	SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- A. The Resources and Development Committee by resolution RDCMY-14-25 approved a right-of-way to the New Mexico Department of Transportation for construction, operation, maintenance for NMDOT US 64 Milepost 8.1 to 13.8. RDCMY-14-25 (without exhibits) is attached as **Exhibit A**.
- B. The New Mexico Department of Transportation requests an amendment to RDCMY-14-25 to approve a waiver of valuation pursuant to 25 CFR § 169.110.
- C. 25 CFR § 169.110 addresses waiver of valuation for a right-of-way over or across tribal land. It states:
 - (a) A right-of-way over or across tribal land may allow for any payment amount negotiated by the tribe, and we will defer to the tribe and not require a valuation if the tribe submits a tribal authorization expressly stating that it:
 - (1) Has agreed upon compensation satisfactory to the tribe;
 - (2) Waives valuation; and
 - (3) Has determined that accepting such agreed-upon compensation and waiving valuation is in its best interest.
 - (b) The tribe may request, in writing, that we determine fair market value, in which case we will use a valuation in accordance with § 169.114. After providing the tribe with the fair market value, we will defer to a tribe's decision to allow for any compensation negotiated by the tribe.
 - (c) If the conditions in paragraph (a) or (b) of this section are not met, we will require that the grantee pay fair market value based on a valuation in accordance with \S 169.114.

SECTION THREE. APPROVING WAIVER OF VALUATION OF THE RIGHT-OF-WAY

A. The Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council hereby approves an amendment to RDCMY-14-25 by waiving the valuation of the right-of-way to New Mexico Department of Transportation because the agreed upon compensation is satisfactory and it has determined that accepting such agreed-upon compensation and waiving valuation is in the Nation's best interest.
