#### TITLE OF RESOLUTION: AN ACTION RELATING TO LAW AND ORDER, HEALTH, EDUCATION AND HUMAN SERVICES, BUDGET AND FINANCE, AND NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEES AND THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; AMENDING THE DINÉ HIGHER EDUCATION GRANT FUND, 12 N.N.C. § 2301 ET SEQ. BY APPROVING \$30 MILLION ANNUALLY TO BE DISTRIBUTED EQUALLY AMONG DINÉ COLLEGE, NAVAJO TECHNICAL UNIVERSITY, AND THE OFFICE OF NAVAJO NATION SCHOLARSHIP AND FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

**PURPOSE:** The proposed resolution will increase annual appropriations provided to Diné College, Navajo Technical University, and the Office of Navajo Nation Scholarship & Financial Assistance by amending the "Diné Higher Education Grant Fund" at 12 N.N.C. § 2301 *et seq.*

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21	SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY	
22	A. The Law and Order Committee has the power to review and make recommendations to	
23	the Navajo Nation Council on proposed amendments to and enactments in the Navajo	
24	Nation Code. 2 N.N.C. § 601(B) (14).	
25	B. The Health, Education and Human Services Committee was established as a standing	
. 26	committee of the Navajo Nation Council with authority to review and recommend	
27	resolutions relating to education and shall review and approve all requests which will	
28	require the use of money from the Diné Higher Education Grant Fund for	
29	development and operating projects. 2 N.N.C. § 400(A), § 401(B)(6), 12 N.N.C. §	
30	2303(A).	
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- C. The Budget and Finance Committee was established as a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council with the authority to review and recommend to the Council the budgeting, appropriation, investment and management of all funds. 2 N.N.C. § 300(A), § 301(B)(2).
- D. The Naabik'iyáti' Committee was established as a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council with the authority to hear all proposed resolutions that require final action by the Navajo Nation Council. 2 N.N.C. § 164 (A)(9), § 700(A).
- E. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing body of the Navajo Nation with authority to review and approve amendments to Navajo Nation laws. 2 N.N.C. § 102(A) and 2 N.N.C. § 164(A).

#### SECTION TWO. FINDINGS.

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- A. Diné College, Navajo Technical University, and the Office of Navajo Nation Scholarship & Financial Assistance request the Navajo Nation increase the amount of annual appropriations provided from the Diné Higher Education Grant Fund.
- B. Established in 1968, Diné College is chartered as a nonprofit educational institution wholly-owned by the Navajo Nation. As a four-year higher education institution, Diné College is committed to building on the academic advancements of the Navajo people, advancing the success of every student, and sustaining the efforts on affordable and accessible education. The College provides educational opportunities at six locations throughout the Navajo Nation. The funding received from the Navajo Nation allows the College to provide quality education and other services in a consistent manner without having to curtail services to students and the people of the Navajo Nation. Diné College has provided a detailed justification attached as Exhibit A.
- C. In 1979, the Navajo Nation founded the Navajo Skills Center, now the Navajo Technical University. Since its founding, Navajo Technical University has expanded its academic programs and student support services with a focus on research beneficial to the Navajo Nation. Navajo Technical University is now the premier tribal higher education research institution in the country that houses the first

accredited Ph.D offered by a tribal institution of higher education. With this growth, there is a clear need for additional funding to provide state-of-the-art campus facilities (i.e., research and classroom facilities, student and faculty housing), recruit top-notch faculty and staff, and expand student support services. Navajo Technical University has provided a detailed justification attached as **Exhibit B**.

- D. From 2018 to 2023, the Office of Navajo Nation Scholarship & Financial Assistance ("ONNSFA") provided awards to approximately 50 percent of the total number of students submitting applications each calendar year. ONNSFA has exhausted its annual funding every year over the last 20 years. For the 2023 Calendar Year, 13,404 Navajo students requested a Navajo Nation scholarship award. However, for the 2023 Calendar Year, the Navajo Nation awarded 6,264 students (47 percent) of the 13,404 students who submitted scholarship requests. There is a clear need for additional funding for Navajo students pursuing post-secondary education. ONNSFA has provided a detailed justification attached as Exhibit C.
  - E. Given the reasons stated, the Navajo Nation finds it in the best interest of the Navajo Nation to amend Title 12 of the Navajo Nation Code, as set forth herein.

# SECTION THREE. AMENDING THE DINÉ HIGHER EDUCATION GRANT FUND, 12 N.N.C. § 2301 *ET SEQ*.

The Navajo Nation hereby amends Title 12 of the Navajo Nation Code, as follows:

# NAVAJO NATION CODE ANNOTATED TITLE 12. FISCAL MATTERS

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## **CHAPTER 23. DINÉ HIGHER EDUCATION GRANT FUND**

§ 2301. Establishment

There is established the "Diné Higher Education Grant Fund" (hereinafter "Fund"). The Fund shall be held in trust for the <u>gG</u>overnmental <u>uU</u>nits set forth herein. Thereafter, the Office of the Controller shall deposit into such fund the sum of twelve thirty million four

hundred thousand dollars (\$12,400,000.00 \$30,000,000) per fiscal year from annual recurring revenue sources. Any money deposited into the Fund plus accrued interest, shall be used only as provided herein. Diné College, Navajo Technical University and the Office of Navajo Nation Scholarship and & Financial Assistance Program shall provide an annual report on funds provided to the oversight Health, Education and Human Services Committee and Naabik'íyáti' Committee.

## § 2302. Purpose

The purpose of this Fund is to establish a special permanent fund to provide funds annual appropriations as developed and subject to approval by the Health, Education and Human Services Committee and recommended to the Navajo Nation Council.

## § 2303. Definitions

A. For purposes of this Chapter, "Governmental Units" means Diné College, Navajo Technical University, and Office of Navajo Nation Scholarship & Financial Assistance, individually.

<u>B. For purposes of this Chapter, "Operation(s)" means all day-to-day business and other</u> <u>functions of Diné College and Navajo Technical University, including, but not limited to,</u> <u>academic instruction, administrative services, student support services, creative activity,</u> <u>community events, campus safety, and the security, maintenance of the flagship and</u> <u>satellite campuses, and authorize activities and functions provided for in Dine College's</u> <u>and Navajo Technical University's respective charters.</u>

## § 2303<u>4</u>. Fund Administration

A. Legislative Oversight. The Navajo Nation Council Health, Education and Human Services Committee shall review and approve all requests from the <u>gG</u>overnmental <u>uU</u>nits which will require the use of money from the Fund for development and operating projects.

B. Program Management. As authorized by their enabling legislation or plan of operations, the <u>gG</u>overnmental  $\frac{1}{2}$  units shall use the funds:

The Fund shall be distributed yearly in the following amounts: 1. Diné College......\$4,700,000 10,000,000 2. Navajo Technical College ......\$4,200,000- <u>10,000,000</u> E. Fund Management/Accounting. The records and books of account for the gGovernmental uUnits shall be kept separate from the Navajo General Fund as a separate Fund with its own Balance Sheet and Revenue and Expenditure Statement. Day to day accounting for the Fund shall be performed by the <u>gG</u> overnmental <u>uU</u> nits in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles. The Governmental uU nits shall account for the funds spent out of the Fund. Such accounting shall be included as part of the Annual Audit of the Navajo Nation submitted to the Navajo Nation Council. § 2305. Distribution of Annual, Supplemental, and Special Appropriations to Diné College and Navajo Technical University

Annual appropriated funds shall be directly distributed in full on October 1st of each fiscal year.

## § 2304<u>6</u>. Effective period

The effective date of the Fund shall be the beginning of Fiscal Year 2006, and shall be maintained for twenty (20) fiscal years in perpetuity thereafter.

SECTION FOUR. CODIFICATION

The provisions of this resolution that amend or adopt new sections of the Navajo Nation Code shall be codified by the Office of Legislative Counsel. The Office of Legislative Counsel shall incorporate such amended provisions in the next codification of the Navajo Nation Code.

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## SECTION FIVE. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Action shall become effective in accordance with 2 N.N.C. §221(B). However, the first appropriation of general funds by the Navajo Nation pursuant to the amended amounts approved herein shall begin in Navajo Nation Fiscal Year 2028.

#### SECTION SIX. SAVING CLAUSE

If any portion of this Action is determined invalid by the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, or by a District Court of the Navajo Nation without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, the remainder of this Action shall be the law of the Navajo Nation.
