PURPOSE: The purpose of this proposed resolution is to remove Heather L. Clah, Esq. as the Navajo Nation Attorney General.

PROPOSED NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL RESOLUTION 25th NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL—Third Year, 2025

AN ACTION

RELATING TO AN EMERGENCY FOR THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; REMOVING HEATHER CLAH AS ATTORNEY GENERAL OF THE NAVAJO NATION

BE IT RESOLVED:

SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

- A. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing body of the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. § 102(A). As such, the Navajo Nation Council may consider proposed legislation regarding an emergency matter pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(16).
- B. "[M]atters constituting an emergency shall be limited to the cessation of law enforcement services, and disaster relief services, fire protection services or other direct services required as an entitlement under Navajo Nation or Federal law, or which directly threaten the sovereignty of the Navajo Nation. Such an emergency matter must arise due to the pressing public need for such resolution(s) and must be a matter requiring final action by the Council." 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(16).
- C. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 1962(B), the Navajo Nation Attorney General serves at the pleasure of the Navajo Nation Council and can be removed from her position with or without cause by action of the Navajo Nation Council.

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- A. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 1964(A), "[t]he Attorney General is the Chief Legal Officer of the Navajo Nation and, unless otherwise provided by Navajo Nation law, shall have charge of the Department of Justice and of all legal matters in which the Navajo Nation government has an interest."
- B. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 1964(B), "[t]he Attorney General shall "render legal services to the Navajo Nation government, including its Chapters, branches, and entities, subject to available resources, as may be required".
- C. "The Attorney General and Deputy Attorney General shall be licensed attorneys. The Attorney General and Deputy Attorney General shall be appointed by the Navajo Nation Council, upon the recommendation of the President, to serve at a negotiated salary. The appointment shall be effective upon the approval of the Navajo Nation Council, for a term concurrent with the term of the President. The Attorney General and Deputy Attorney General shall serve at the pleasure of the Navajo Nation Council. All other attorneys shall serve at a negotiated salary and at the pleasure of the Attorney General." 2 N.N.C. § 1962(B).
- D. This legislation is put forth as an emergency measure given the Attorney General's authorities to provide legal advice to Navajo Nation entities providing direct services to the Navajo people.

SECTION THREE. REMOVAL OF HEATHER CLAH AS ATTORNEY GENERAL OF THE NAVAJO NATION

As of the Effective Date of this Action, Heather Clah shall be removed as the Attorney General of the Navajo Nation.

SECTION FOUR. RECOGNIZING VACANCIES AND APPROVAL PROCESS

The Navajo Nation Council hereby recognizes that there is not currently a confirmed Deputy Attorney General to act in the place of the removed Attorney General. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 1962(B), an appointment of an Attorney General and a Deputy Attorney General recommended
