18	SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY	
19	A. The Health, Education and Human Services Committee has oversight of the Navajo	
20	Nation Board of Education, and colleges within the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. § 401(C)	
. 21	(3). The Health, Education and Human Services Committee has the authority to review	
22	and recommend resolutions relating to education in accordance with 2 N.N.C. §	
23	401(B)(6)(a).	
24	B. The Naabik'íyáti' Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation and is	
25	authorized to confirm members to the Diné College Board of Regents. 2 N.N.C. §§	
. 26	700(A) and 10 N.N.C. § 2003(C),	
27	C. The President of the Navajo Nation shall recommend appointed member candidates to	
28	serve on the Board of Regents. Candidates are subject to the confirmation by the	
29	Naabik'íyáti' Committee of the Navajo Nation Council. These appointments will include	
30	criteria based on the appointee's expertise. Some areas of expertise include, but not	

limited to education, business, investment, healthcare, traditional knowledge, and/or legal. The number of new appointments for Board seats shall not exceed the half of the board's membership. 10 N.N.C. § 2003(C).

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- A. The Board of Regents (the "Board") is vested with all powers to govern effectively and set policy for Diné College in accordance with laws of the Navajo Nation and applicable State and Federal laws. It is the responsibility of the Board to establish the process for the accomplishment of the purposes mission of Diné College, ensure the College's fiscal integrity, conduct business in an exemplary fashion with appropriate transparency, preserve and protect the College's autonomy and ensure to the College provides its students a quality education. Subject to applicable laws, employees and officials of the Navajo Nation and candidates for Navajo Nation office shall not interfere with or interrupt the day-to-day activities of the Board of Regents or Diné College employees carrying out their responsibilities as such. 10 N.N.C. § 2003(A).
- B. All appointed members of the Board of Regents shall meet the following qualifications:
 - 1. Bachelor's Degree, from an accredited institution, or experience equivalent to such.
 - 2. Must be at least eighteen (18) years of age at the time of the appointment; and
 - 3. Must not be an employee of the Diné College; and
 - 4. Must not have a conflict of interest with the College President or any member of the Executive management team of Diné College; and
 - 5. Must have good moral and ethical character revealing no dishonesty or moral turpitude within the five (5) years preceding the recommended date of appointment as demonstrated by the appointment and confirmation process. Must not have any felony convictions.
 - 6. All Appointed members shall possess, at least, one of the following expertise:
 - a) A professional qualification i.e. certified public accountant, financing, investment, or legal background,

- b) A business background with at least five (5) years of executive management, executive management experience in areas such as business, healthcare, social services or similar need on the Navajo Nation.
- c) A good understanding of Diné spiritual ceremonial knowledge, preferably Hataalii, or,
- d) Expertise in higher education and/or education.

10 N.N.C. § 2003(B)(1).

- C. Pursuant to 10 N.N.C. § 2003(C)(1)(a), in the event the Naabik'íyáti' Committee of the Navajo Nation Council appointed member declines or fails for any reason to pass a resolution confirming their appointment made by the Navajo Nation President within thirty (30) calendar days of the appointment:
 - 1. The appointee shall not sit as a Diné College Board of Regent; and
 - 2. The Navajo Nation President shall submit an alternative appointee within fourteen (14) calendar days of the Naabik'íyáti' Committee of the Navajo Nation Council action failing/declining to confirm the appointment, or the expiration of the thirty (30) calendar day confirmation period.
- D. The Navajo Nation President Dr. Buu Nygren by an appointment letter dated September 6, 2024 has appointed Dr. Dolly Manson to serve on the Diné College Board of Regents for a terms of six (6) years, attached as Exhibit A. According to President Nygren's letter, Dr. Dolly Manson has "experience in higher education, dedication to the improvement of our educational systems, and expertise, aligns perfectly with my mission and goals."
- E. Dr. Dolly Manson meets the qualifications as required by 10 N.N.C § 2003(B)(1). Dr. Manson's Letter of Interest and Resume attached as Exhibit B and Exhibit C, respectively.

27 SECTION THREE. APPROVAL

The Navajo Nation hereby finds that Dr. Dolly Manson meets the qualifications set forth in 10 N.N.C. § 2003(B)(1) and confirms the appointment of Dr. Dolly Manson to serve on the Diné
