Delegate Vince R. James celebrates home key turnover with Ganado community members



Council Delegate Vince R. James celebrated a major milestone as three Ganado community members received keys to their new homes.

GANADO, Ariz. – On Friday, Council Delegate Vince R. James joined community members to celebrate a major milestone as three Ganado community members received keys to their new homes through the Navajo Nation's Community Housing and Infrastructure Department (CHID) Housing project funded through the American Rescue Plan Act.

"Today we celebrate three Ganado voters who now have a safe, stable place to call home. These homes represent dignity, security, and a fresh start for our elders and families. I'm proud to stand with them as they begin this new chapter," said Delegate Vince R. James.

The homes, provided through the Division of Community Development's CHID ARPA program, were manufactured by HomeDirect. Each residence includes new appliances, a solid foundation, and accessible utility connections for water, gas, and electricity. The homes are designed to offer long-term stability and comfort for families who have waited years for housing assistance.

Community members living near Ganado, Cornfield, and the Steamboat area have been anticipating housing support since the early stages of the CHID housing initiative. The key turnover was a meaningful moment for the family members, and they expressed their gratitude for the collaborative effort between CHID staff and local chapter officials.

During the event, homeowners received guidance on maintaining their new homes to ensure long-term quality and durability. Officials encouraged proactive care, including proper heating and routine upkeep, to help the homes settle and perform well in changing weather conditions. The CHID team also reaffirmed its commitment to follow-up inspections and responsive support to address any construction-related concerns.

The key turnover celebration reflected more than the delivery of housing. It marked progress, partnership, and renewed hope for Ganado voters who now step forward with the security of homeownership.
