

18 SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

- 19 A. The Resources and Development Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo
20 Nation Council with oversight authority over the Division of Transportation. 2
21 N.N.C. §501 (C)(1).
22 B. The Health, Education and Human Services Committee is a standing committee of
23 the Navajo Nation Council with the enumerated power to establish Navajo Nation
24 policy, promulgate rules and regulations governing human services and general
25 government services of the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. § 401(B)(1).

26
27 SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- 28 A. The Navajo Division of Transportation was established within the Executive
29 Branch of the Navajo Nation government to administer transportation programs
30 throughout the Navajo Nation, to ensure effective and efficient transportation

1 operations, to promote the continued improvement of the transportation system,
2 and to provide the necessary resources to accomplish these objectives. 2 N.N.C. §§
3 1370 and 1371.

4 B. The Navajo Division of Transportation has submitted the Navajo Division of
5 Transportation Driving Record Policy (or "Driving Record Policy") for approval.
6 The Driving Record Policy is attached as **Exhibit A**.

7 C. "The purpose of this policy is to provide guidance to Navajo Department of
8 Transportation (DOT) personnel regarding the requirement to submit annual
9 driving records." The "Navajo DOT adopts the concept of a "Safe Systems
10 Approach," to eliminate or reduce potential safety hazards by compelling Navajo
11 DOT employees to engage in compliant, crash-free, and responsible driving
12 behavior. The Safe System Approach is the guiding paradigm for the Federal
13 Division of Transportation's National Roadway Safety Strategy." **Exhibit A**,
14 Driving Record Policy.

15 D. The Navajo Nation Department of Justice Request for Services ("DOJ Request for
16 Services") was reviewed by Department of Justice Natural Resources Unit and
17 found "Sufficient." The DOJ Request for Services Cover Sheet is attached as
18 **Exhibit B**.

19
20 **SECTION THREE. APPROVAL**

21 The Resources and Development Committee hereby approves **Exhibit A**, the Navajo
22 Division of Transportation Driving Record Policy.
