Speaker Curley advocates for the Navajo Nation at the New Mexico Tribal Leaders Summit



Speaker Crystalayne Curley advocated for stronger partnerships and continued investments to support Navajo communities across New Mexico.

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. – On Thursday, 25th Navajo Nation Council Speaker Crystalayne Curley joined tribal leaders, New Mexico Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham, and state agencies at the New Mexico Tribal Leaders Summit to advocate for stronger support and investments for Navajo communities within the state.

During the summit, Speaker Curley spoke about the urgent need to continue addressing missing persons, calling for stronger coordination between tribal, state, and federal agencies to improve public safety and bring answers to families.

Speaker Curley has supported the efforts of Council members from New Mexico who worked with state legislators to support state legislative bills that helped to secure infrastructure funding and initiatives such as the Turquoise Alert.

Speaker Curley highlighted the importance of capital outlay investments, and technical support, for infrastructure, roads, water, public safety facilities, and schools serving Navajo communities in New Mexico.

She emphasized the need for continued partnerships with state leaders to ensure tribal communities receive adequate funding and long-term support.

“The future of our Navajo communities is brighter when we have strong partnerships and continued investments in our people,” said Speaker Curley. “We must continue working together to protect our families, strengthen our communities, and ensure our children have every opportunity to succeed.”

The summit brought together tribal leaders, educators, legislators, and state agencies to strengthen government-to-government collaboration and advance priorities impacting tribal communities throughout New Mexico.
