PURPOSE: This legislation, if approved, will authorize the acceptance of three mobile trailers and associated equipment, valued at \$367,629.71, as donations to the Navajo Division of Public Safety for use by the Navajo Nation Emergency Medical Service.

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

- A. The Naabik'iyati' Committee is a standing committee of Navajo Nation Council. 2 N.N.C. § 700 (A).
- B. Navajo Nation public officials, elected or non-elected, who receive gifts, whether intended as a gift to the individual official or to the Navajo Nation, shall record or cause to be recorded such gift with the Ethics and Rules Office. 2 N.N.C. § 1012.
- C. The President of the Navajo Nation shall, for and on behalf of the Navajo Nation, accept or decline gifts of property, including monetary donations, provided that

any such acceptance or refusal of a gift with an estimated value in excess of \$1,000 shall be with the concurrence of the Naabik'iyati' Committee. 2 N.N.C. § 1010.

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- A. The Indian Health Service (“IHS”), an agency of the United States Department of Health and Human Services (“DHHS”), has provided all required documentation supporting transfer and donation of three mobile trailers, along with associated office and medical equipment, to be received by the Navajo Division of Public Safety Emergency Medical Services program. Three (3) DHHS, “Request for Property Action Forms,” corresponding to twenty-one (21) donated IHS assets are attached hereto as **Exhibit A**.
- B. Total value of the donated assets, described herein and in **Exhibit A**, is \$367,629.71, and comprised as follows:
 1. Two (2) mobile trailers and associated office and medical equipment, from Inscription House Health Center, valued at \$235,439.96; and
 2. One (1) mobile trailer and associated office and medical equipment, from Kayenta Health Center, valued at \$132,189.75.
- C. DHHS Navajo Area IHS Kayenta Service Unit issued a letter of support, dated June 30, 2026, for the proposed asset donation, attached hereto as **Exhibit B**.

SECTION THREE. APPROVAL

- A. The Navajo Nation hereby accepts three (3) mobile trailers and associated office and medical equipment, donated by IHS, for use by the Navajo Division of Public Safety Emergency Medical Services program.
- B. The Navajo Division of Public Safety Emergency Medical Services program shall record the receipt of all asset donations with the Navajo Nation Ethics and Rules Office, in accordance with 2 N.N.C. § 1012.

SECTION FOUR. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Action shall become effective in accordance with 2 N.N.C. § 221(C) and 2 N.N.C. § 189.
