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25th Navajo Nation Council to convene 2026 Summer Session

WINDOW ROCK, Ariz. — The 25th Navajo Nation Council will convene the 2026 Summer Session on Monday, July 20, at 10 a.m. in the Navajo Nation Council Chamber in the Nation's capital of Window Rock.

"During the Summer Session, the Council will consider legislation, address pressing issues, and take action on matters that shape the future of the Navajo Nation," said Speaker Crystalyne Curley. "I encourage all Navajo citizens to participate by attending the session or following the proceedings online. An informed and engaged public strengthens our government, promotes transparency, and reinforces accountability in the work we do on behalf of the Navajo people."

Prior to the opening session on Monday, the Missing and Murdered Diné Relatives Task Force will host the Every Child Matters Awareness Walk beginning at 8:00 a.m. at the Navajo Nation Museum and concluding at the Navajo Nation Council Chamber.

Members of the 25th Navajo Nation Council will also complete the final leg of the 2026 Summer Session Trail Ride on Monday morning, departing the Navajo Nation Fairgrounds at 8:30 a.m. and arriving at the Navajo Nation Council Chamber at approximately 9 a.m.

Opening day ceremonies will include the posting of the colors by the Shiprock Chapter

Veterans. Miss Navajo Nation 2025–2026 Camille Uentillie will lead the Pledge of Allegiance and perform the National Anthem. The opening invocation will be delivered by water rights advocate Earl Tullie.

In accordance with Title 2 of the Navajo Nation Code, the Council is also scheduled to receive the State of the Navajo Nation Address on Monday.

The 2026 Summer Session will continue through Friday, July 24, as the Council considers legislation, receives reports, and addresses matters affecting the Navajo Nation.

The 25th Navajo Nation Council encourages the public to attend the opening day of the 2026 Summer Session or follow the proceedings through the Council's livestream. The session will be broadcast live on the Council's Facebook page (@navajonationcouncil) and YouTube channel (@NavajoNationCouncil).
